1951 DISTRICT CENSUS HANDBOOK

DANGS DISTRICT

Dangs is a newly-created district, with a population (1951 census) of 47,282 and an area of 657.6 square miles, formed after the merger of the Dangs States of the former Gujarat States Agency with the Province of Bombay.

On the creation of the new district of Dangs, three villages were transferred from Dangs to Surat, and two villages from Surat district were included in it.

This Handbook consists of tables for Dangs district compiled after the 1951 Census of India. The main results of the 1951 Census are embodied in the State Tables published for the States of Bombay, Saurashtra and Kutch. In this Handbook the data are exhibited in greater detail. The numbers given to tables in this publication correspond to those given in the State Census Report. The following tables for the district have, however, not been included in this Handbook:—

A-II Variation in population during fifty years.

D-IV Migrants.

In the E-Summary table, some columns have been omitted.

In the case of the C-series of tables, the data were extracted on the basis of a sample count of approximately 10% of the census slips instead of a full count of all the slips.

There are no towns in Dangs district and so the question of preparing the following tables for the district did not arise:—

A-IV Towns classified by population.

A-V Towns arranged Territorially with Population by Livelihood Classes.

Similarly there were no non-Indian nationals in Dangs district at the time of the census and so there is no D-VI table, which gives figures of non-Indian nationals.

In 1941, the population figures were exhibited according to communities in the "Village Handbooks" published by the Government of Bombay. There was of course no handbook for the Dangs in 1941 as it did not form part of the Province of Bombay. In 1951, the basis of classification at the census was changed from a social to an ~~economic~~ one, and the figures for villages given in the Primary Census Abstract and in Tables B-I, B-II, C-II and E are according to the following eight Livelihood Classes:—

Agricultural Classes

- I Cultivators of land, wholly or mainly owned and their dependants.
- II Cultivators of land, wholly or mainly unowned and their dependants.
- III Cultivating labourers and their dependants.
- IV Non-cultivating owners of land; agricultural rent receivers; and their dependants.

Non-Agricultural Classes

Persons (including dependants) who derive their principal means of livelihood from:—

- V Production other than cultivation.
- VI Commerce.
- VII Transport.
- VIII Other services and miscellaneous sources.

Dependants, whether earning or non-earning, were classified at the census according to the principal means of livelihood of the persons on whom they were dependant.

Primary Census Abstract.

This abstract shows figures of population according to eight main livelihood classes for every village. It is in essence a village directory, with the data exhibited according to livelihood classes, instead of Communities as in 1941.

No area figures could be given in column 3 as the district has not yet been surveyed. The total area of Dangs district as calculated by the Surveyor General of India is 657.6 Sq. miles.

The figures given in columns 4 and 5 and 9 to 12 have been extracted from the National Register of Citizens, prepared by enumerators after the Census. These Registers consisted of transcription of the replies to the more important Census questions in respect of every person enumerated. Figures of literates according to tracts, derived from the census slips, shown in table D-VII are more reliable than the village figures derived from the National Registers. The Census slip on which the replies to the Census questions were recorded was the main document. The National Register was merely a copy.

In addition, mistakes seem to have occurred while extracting literacy figures for villages in the Tabulation Office. The percentage of literacy in the district was 6.37% according to table D-VII, a figure which is more by 0.92% than the figure of 5.45% derived from sorting the 10% sample slips, while the literacy figure according to the Primary Census Abstract was 5.24%.

Information contained in columns 21 to 23 has been extracted from the data collected for each village by the Bombay District Gazetteers (Revision) Editorial Board.
