PRIMARY CENSUS ABSTRACT**

F O R E W O R D

1. The District Census Handbook (DCHB) published by Census Organisation since 1951 census, is one of the important publications in the context of planning and development at gross-root level. The publication, which is brought out for each district, contains several demographic and socio-economic characteristics village-wise and town-wise of the district alongwith the status of availability of civic amenities, infrastructural facilities, etc.

2. The scope of the DCHB was initially confined to a few Census Tables and Primary Census Abstract (PCA) of each village and town within the district. Thereafter, at successive censuses, its scope and coverage has been enlarged. The DCHB published at the 1961 census provided a descriptive account of the district, administrative statistics, census tables and a village and town directory including PCA. The 1971 census-DCHB series was in three parts: Part-A related to village and town directory, Part-B to village and town PCA and Part-C comprised analytical report, administrative statistics, district census tables and certain analytical tables based on PCA and amenity data in respect of villages. The 1981 census DCHB was in two parts: Part-A contained village and town directory and Part-B the PCA of village and town including the SCs and STs PCA up to taluk/town levels. New features alongwith restructuring of the formats of village and town directory were added into it. In Village Directory, all amenities except electricity were brought together and if any amenity was not available in the referent village, the distance in broad ranges from the nearest place having such an amenity, was given. Information on new items such as adult literacy centres, primary health sub-centres and community health workers in the village were provided so as to meet the requirements of some of the Revised Minimum Needs Programme. Information on approach to the village was provided for the first time in the Village Directory so as to give the details on number of inaccessible villages in each district. In the Town Directory, a statement (IV-A) on slums was introduced to provide the details on civic and other amenities in the notified slums of Class I and Class II towns.

3. The 1991 census DCHB, by and large, followed the pattern of presentation of 1981 census, except the format of PCA was restructured. Nine-fold industrial classification of main workers was given against the four-fold industrial classification presented in the 1981 census. In addition, sex-wise population in 0-6 age group was included in the PCA for the first time with a view to enable the data users to compile more realistic literacy rate as all children below 7 years of age had been treated as illiterate at the time of 1991 census. One of the important innovations in the 1991 census was the Community Development Block (CD block) level presentation of village directory and PCA data instead of the traditional taluk/PS level presentation. It was expected that the presentation of village directory and PCA data at CD block level will help the planners in formulation of micro level development plans, CD block being lowest administrative unit.

4. The present series of 2001 census DCHBs have been made more informative and exhaustive in terms of coverage and content. The Village Directory has been enlarged in scope by including a number of other facilities like banking, recreational and cultural facilities, newspapers and magazines and 'most important commodity' manufactured in village. Income and expenditure of gram panchayat, wherever possible, has been provided. Apart from these, more details on distance(s) at which basic amenities are available (if not available in the village), are given. This includes educational facilities (namely primary and middle schools and college), medical facilities (viz. Allopathic Hospital, Maternity & Child Welfare Centre and Primary Health Centre), drinking water, post & telegraph (post office and phone), communication, bank, credit societies and recreational facilities. In Town Directory, the statement on Slums has been modified and its coverage enlarged by including details on all slums instead of 'notified slums'. The information is given in case of all statutory towns irrespective

of their class, against only Class I and Class II towns in the 1981 and 1991 censuses. The basic amenities available in the villages and towns are analysed in depth with the help of a number of cross-classified inset tables and statements. Two other significant additions in the publication are inclusion of 'motif' highlighting significant characteristic of the district and analytical notes as annexures. The analytical notes on (i) fertility and mortality and (ii) various measures of fertility and mean age at marriage are prepared based on 1991 census. Whereas, in the notes relating to (i) percentage distribution of migrants by place of birth/place of last residence, (ii) main religions, (iii) marital status of population, (iv) age, sex and education, and (v) distribution of spectrum of mother tongue, nature and extent of changes occurred in the district in its basic socio-demographic features during the decade 1991-2001 are analysed. The eight digits permanent location code (PLCN) to all the villages and towns have been assigned keeping in view the future needs.

5. The village and town level amenity data have been collected, compiled and computerized in prescribed record structure under the supervision of Shri.H.Shashidhar, Director of Census Operations, Karnataka. Thereafter, efforts have been made to ensure comparability of the information with that of 1991 census data and the information brought out by the respective state governments in their annual reports and statistical handbooks for various years after 1991. The task of planning, designing and co-ordination of this publication was carried out by Shri R.G. Mitra, Deputy Registrar General (C&T) and Dr. I.C. Agrawal, Senior Research Officer of Social Studies Division, Dr. R.P. Singh, Deputy Registrar General (Map) provided the technical guidance in the preparation of maps. Whereas, Shri Anil Kumar Arora, Deputy Director of Data Processing Division who worked under the overall supervision of Shri Himakar, Addl. Director (EDP) helped in preparation of record structure for computerization of village and town directory data and the programme for the generation of Village Directory and Town Directory statements including analytical inset tables. The draft DCHB manuscripts received from the Census Directorates have been scrutinized in the Social Studies Division under the guidance of Shri S.L. Jain, Deputy Director and Shri R.K. Mehta, Assistant Director. I am thankful to all of them and other who have contributed to make this publication possible.

Harangi Reservoir in Kodagu District

The Harangi project comprises of a reservoir across the river Harangi, a tributary to Cauveri River in the Cauvery basin, near Hudgur of Somvarpet taluk. Canals on the both banks are constructed for providing irrigation to an extent of 53,591 hectares in Kodagu, Hassan and Mysore districts. Catchment area of the Dam is 419.58 Sq.Kms yielding 39.30 Thousand Million Cubic Feet (TMC). The cost of the project is 373 crores.

Harangi dam is 846 Mtrs long with a height of 46.94 Mtrs, masonry dam with a gross storage capac-

ity of 8.50 TMC. With the construction of this reservoir an area of 1,909 hectares of land is submerged affecting 11 villages having population of 700.

153 Kms. long Left Bank Canal and 160 Kms. long Right Bank Canal will provide irrigation to 11,927 hectares and 41,664 hectares respectively.

Construction of this masonry dam and 153 Kms. long Left Bank Canal has been completed and the construction work of the Right Bank Canal is completed up to 122 Kms.

P R E F A C E

In the foreword to the 2001 series of the District Census Handbooks, Sri. D.K. Sikri, I.A.S., the Registrar General and Census Commissioner, India, has traced the history of the District Census Handbooks. He has also succinctly explained the scope and coverage of the District Census Handbooks. These volumes contain salient data on the population for every village and town as revealed by 2001 Census. They also contain a wealth of information regarding villages and towns which, throw some light on the circumstances in which people live and is therefore relevant to the data on the population. This information is also of considerable importance in the context of planned development.

The District Census Handbook is divided into two parts: Part A contains information regarding each village and town (Village Directory and Town Directory collected from various sources) and Part B which contains the data on the population collected during 2001 Census - the Primary Census Abstract. The data published in Part B was collected during February-March 2001 in the Population Census.

The process of data collection for the Village Directory and the Town Directory (Part A) commenced in 1999. The Village Directory formats were mailed to the Deputy Commissioners of Districts for obtaining the village wise particulars through Village Accountants. Similarly the Town Directory formats were mailed to the Commissioners of Corporations, Chief Officers of Town Municipal Councils, Town Panchayats, etc. The village wise and town wise data furnished by these officers were then examined exhaustively for consistency in reporting and comparability with the information published in the 1991 District Census Handbooks. The Household Schedules, which were canvassed to collect the population data during 2001 Census, were scanned and data captured was processed electronically. The Primary Census Abstract was generated centrally on the computers by Registrar General, India.

In compilation of the District Census Handbooks, the Census Directorate had the co-operation of various departments of the State/Central Government. The Census Directorate gratefully acknowledge their assistance.

I take this opportunity to offer my grateful thanks to Sri. H. Shashidhar, Director of Census Operations and Sri. S.R. Raghavendra Rao, Deputy Director (Retd.) for their valuable guidance. I am also thankful to all the officers and officials of this Directorate who have been actively involved in the compilation of this volume.

I am highly grateful to Sri. J.K.Banthia, I.A.S., Ex. Registrar General, India for the benefit I have derived by way of guidance and advice. I express my thanks to Sri R.G. Mitra, Ex. Deputy Registrar General (C&T) and Dr. I.C. Agrawal, Assistant Registrar General and Sri S.L.Jain Deputy Director of Social Studies Division and Dr. R.P. Singh, Ex. Deputy Registrar General (Map) for their guidance.

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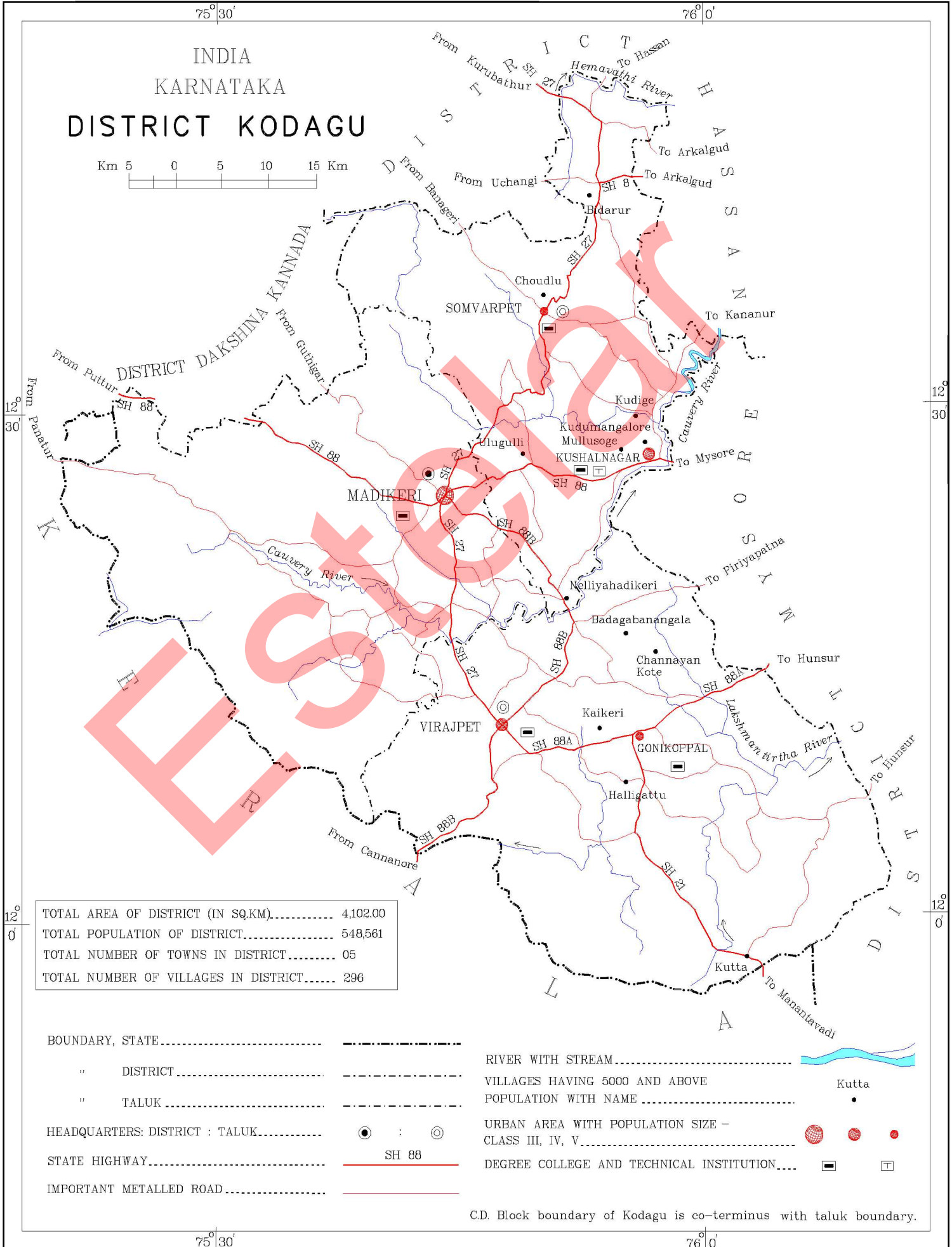

DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS - 2001 CENSUS

- 1 Among the urban population, Madikeri town with 91.02 per cent stands first in the literacy rate in the State, Karnataka.
- 2 The district has recorded a population of 548,561 comprising 274,831 males and 273,730 females, the lowest in the State, among the 27 districts.
- 3 Kodagu district has 13.7 per cent of urban population, the least in the State.
- 4 In Kodagu district there are 977 female children for every one thousand male children which is the highest in the age group 0-6 in the State.
- 5 There are no class I, II cities / towns in the district.
- 6 The district is famous for coffee, cardamom, orange and pepper plantations.
- 7 The origin of the river Cauvery is situated in this district at Talacauveri.
8. From the point of view of mineral wealth and exploitation thereof, Kodagu is amongst the poorest districts of the State.
- 9 The reserved forest comprises an area of over 1,346 sq.kms. and rank amongst the richest and most valuable forests of the country.
- 10 The forests of Kodagu yield timbers of teak, rosewood and other valuable varieties and a large tract known for their excellent sandalwood bearing qualities.
- 11 Kodavas / Coorgi, the predominant community of Kodagu district, have a martial tradition and qualities.
- 12 Production of honey enjoys an important niche in the economy of the district and 'Coorg Honey' is famous and Kodagu is one of the most important honey producing districts of the State.
- 13 Abbi Water Falls (Formerly known as Jesse Falls), is a noted picnic spot and situated about 5 kms. from Madikeri town.

Analytical Note

(i) HISTORY AND SCOPE OF THE DISTRICT CENSUS HANDBOOK

Introduction

The District Census Handbook is the most valuable district level publication brought out by the Census Organization. It contains micro-level data down to the lowest administrative units viz, revenue village in the case of rural areas and Division/Ward level in the case of urban areas. It is extremely useful to the planners, administrators, demographers, sociologists, etc., as it contains resourceful wealth of data regarding basic amenities available in each villages and towns of the district such as educational, medical, drinking water, post and telegraphs, transportation and communication, banks, societies, recreation, power supply, export/import of important commodities and land use besides, the particulars revealed during the latest census enumeration. It is for the first time that the district census hand book series was included in the census publication programme at the 1951 census, in order to satisfy the growing demand by the administrators, the planners, research scholars, demographers and the other such census data users, for micro-level data. The idea of compiling the District Census Handbooks was pioneered by Sri R.A.Gopala Swamy, I.C.S. the then Registrar General, India and Ex-officio Census Commissioner of India, with a view to preserve the Census records prepared for areas below the district level. He proposed that all the district Census tables and Census abstracts prepared during the process of sorting and compilation, should be bound together in a single manuscript volume and named as the District Census Handbook and suggested that the State Government should take up printing and publication at their own cost. Then onwards, the District Census Handbooks were published in each Census with improved pattern with an aim to give the Census and Non-census data at micro level for each village of the taluk as a whole to suit the requirements of various departments.

The data in the District Census Handbook will help not only in local area planning but also in regulating the provision of goods and services as well as to minimise the regional imbalances in the process of development. The District Census Hand Book sought to replace “Part IV - Taluk Tables and Part V - Village Tables” of the earlier censuses and to present the basic demographic and economic data in the form of “Primary Census Abstract” in respect of each and every village and town within the jurisdiction of the district. The district census handbook consists of two parts, viz, Part A and Part B. Part A comprises village and Town Directory while Part-B contains Village and Town level Primary Census Abstracts. In addition, these volumes contain a set of statistical tables based on the census data in respect of the district and its constituent taluks and towns.

District Census Handbook 1961

It was in 1961 Census that the scope of District Census Hand Book was shaped in the present form by presenting (i) an account of descriptive note on the district, (ii) a set of non-census data tables dealing with the administrative statistics of the district for a decade, (iii) taluk and town level census tables on economic and socio-cultural aspects and (iv) the village and urban Primary Census Abstracts depicting the nine fold industrial classification of workers. Information on the availability of certain basic amenities in villages and towns, such as the source of drinking water and educational institutions was also presented in the volumes. However, the district census handbooks of 3 out of then existing 19 districts viz, Bangalore, Dharwad and Mysore were confined to the publication of the village-wise and urban (census enumeration block-wise) Primary Census Abstract only.

District Census Handbook 1971

During the 1971 census, the district census handbook was further refined to present the data in

a systematic way. In view of countrywide uniformity in approach and to have a comprehensive coverage, the District Census Hand Books were presented in three parts each, for a district. Part A incorporated the Town and Village Directories. Part-B incorporated the Primary Census Abstract and included data, in the case of rural areas down to the village level and in the case of urban areas up to the block level. In addition, an introduction was given wherein the changes in jurisdiction, if any, of the district or of the taluks and the changes in the number of villages between 1961 and 1971 were explained. Part-B was essentially demographic in nature and was the end product of the tabulation of the enumeration results. Part C incorporated other census tables and administrative statistics. For convenience, Part-A and Part-B of the District Census Hand Book were presented in one volume and Part-C in a separate volume. In part-C volume, the district and taluk maps were included. These maps were prepared on the basis of maps obtained from the competent authorities concerned.

District Census Handbook 1981

The District Census Hand Book series of 1981, had some new features along with the restructuring of the formats of village and town directories, keeping in view the comparability of 1971 data. All the amenities except power supply in the village were brought together in the village directory with the instruction that in case an amenity is not available in the referent village, the distance in broad ranges from the nearest place/village where it is available were given. A few new items of information such as adult literacy centres, primary health sub-centres and community health centres/workers, data on the availability of Newspapers, Motor Vehicles, etc., in the village, were introduced in the village directory to meet the requirements of the "Revised Minimum Needs Programmes". A new column "total population and number of households" was introduced to examine the correlation of the amenities with the population and number of households they serve. The contents of Part-A were further enlarged by including two appendices, namely a list of villages not having any amenities and a distribution of villages according to the proportion of Scheduled Castes and Schedules Tribes in the total population of the village. The format of Town Directory were also modified to meet the

requirements of the Minimum Needs Programme by providing information on a few new items such as class of town and its population, population of SC & ST, decadal growth rate of population, working women's hostel, adult literacy classes / centres, storage system regarding drinking water supply etc., and also the information about the nearest place and distance having educational, medical and fire-fighting facilities, in case such a facility is not available in the referent town. A new statement on civic and other amenities in slums in Class I and Class II town were included to help the planners to chalk out their programmes of slum improvements.

District Census Handbook 1991

The presentation of the District Census Hand Book for the 1991 Census was more or less similar to the manner followed in 1981. The format of Primary Census Abstract was restructured slightly. Nine-fold industrial classification of main workers was given as against four-fold classification. The sex-wise population in the age-group of 0-6 was included in the Primary Census Abstract for the first time to enable data users to compute more realistic literacy rates as all the children below 7 years of age were treated as illiterate at the 1991 census. One of the important innovations in the 1991 census was the Community Development Block-level presentation of data in the village directory and Primary Census Abstract instead of the traditional Taluk/PS level presentation. C.D.Block is the lowest administrative unit for developmental planning. The choice of the C.D. Block as the unit for data presentation was formulated to help the planners in micro-level developmental plans. Another important improvement at the 1991 Census was dissemination of data through magnetic tapes/floppies in which both the computer as well as manual codes for each revenue village were provided along with the corresponding codes of 1981 Census. In the volumes of the District Census Hand Books, the computer codes assigned to the revenue villages in the 1991 Census and the corresponding codes of 1981 Census were presented so that it may facilitate the data users to use the data either from magnetic tapes or computer floppies.

Scope of the 2001 District Census Handbook

Like in the previous censuses, the District Census Hand Book (DCHB) for the 2001 Census is brought

out in two parts as usual viz., Part-A The Village and Town Directory, and Part-B the Village and Town Primary Census Abstract.

The District Census Hand Books for the 2001 Census is essentially presented in the similar manner in which the District Census Hand Books of 1991 Census were presented. This is because the data would be comparable with the earlier censuses and also to study the changes taken place during the decades and hence the approach in 2001 Census is similar to 1991 Census. The contents have been slightly enlarged and the formats too are restructured to suit the requirements of the data users. In the village directory for 2001 Census certain new amenities like, news papers, magazine received, Income-Expenditure of the local bodies, information on number of banks, credit societies, recreational and cultural facilities, most important commodities imported, manufactured and exported have been included whereas the information regarding the "Day or Days of market/hat if any" which was there in 1991 has been excluded. Apart from providing the information about the nearest place and distance in broad ranges for villages not having basic educational and medical facilities, information about the nearest place and distance in broad ranges for villages not having Middle School, College, Hospital (Allopathic), Maternity and Child Welfare Center and Primary Health Center are also provided this time. However, in the town directory there are no changes except in the statement IV-A where this statement is separately numbered as Statement VII in 2001. Except these, the scope of 2001 series of the District Census Hand Book has, by and large remained the same as in 1991. The non-census information collected at the village level and town level was scrutinized and verified. In case of glaring discrepancies the data were cross-checked with data made available by the respective parent departments for validation.

One of the significant changes made in 2001 series of District Census Hand Book is that Primary Census Abstracts are available to the jurisdiction of the Panchayats in the district. With the constitution (73rd Amendment) Act, 1992, it has become necessary for the census organisation to provide population data for the territorial area of a panchayat in order to strengthen panchayat raj system in the country. In

view of this, panchayat-wise population figures for total population and for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes population has been compiled and presented in the form of Annexure-I for each district.

Further another important step taken during the 2001 Census, is assigning the Permanent Location Code Numbers (PLCN) to the villages. Location code number is a simple but unique device by which every area in an administrative unit in the State/U.T. can be identified. Thus assigning of Location Code Numbers at various administrative levels, right from State/U.T. to the lowest level namely enumeration block, in census taking is an important step. Each clearly demarcated area can be referred to by a combination of numbers. In a State or U.T. the next administrative area is District, followed by taluk or police station, circle, Development Block or Mandal, etc., in different states/U.T.s. Next below this administrative area, in urban areas are cities/towns, further divided into wards/divisions and villages in rural areas. The Location Code Numbers to various administrative areas are assigned in an orderly manner always beginning from northwest point and the numbering proceeds in a serpentine manner, keeping the geographical continuity, ultimately ending at the South-East point.

There was a great demand from different organizations to study the village level data over a time span and hence a scheme of assigning permanent location code numbers to the villages and the higher levels of administrative areas is devised to ensure data comparability over a period of time. In Indian Census, Location Code Numbers are allotted to each village based on traverse system (zigzag) in a serpentine manner at taluk level. These numbers for villages run from '1' to 'N' in each taluk independently. This system was adopted until 1991 census. But, for the Census of India 2001, all the villages in a state/U.T. are assigned with a Location Code Number in one continuous series beginning from "1" to "N" for the entire state/U.T. and it is not confined to a taluk/Taluk. The field length of the complete PLCN structure for a village has been kept up to 8 digits and therefore the location code number of village in a taluk contains 8 digits number for 2001 Census.

(ii) BRIEF HISTORY OF THE DISTRICT

Kodagu the district, known, as Coorg during the British regime is a tiny mountainous province in South India bounded on the north and east by Hassan and Mysore district and on the West and South by Dakshina Kannada; Cannanore and Kasaragod district of Kerala State. The total area of the district is 4,102 sq.km. The name 'Kodagu' is derived from the word 'Kodimalenad' which means dense forestland on steep hills.

The historical period of Kodagu begin from about 2nd century A.D. with a legendary period before its history begins. Kaveri Mahatmya mentions this area by 3 names viz, Brahma Kshetra, Matsya Desha and Kroda Desha. Lopamudra the daughter of Brahma was adopted by Kaveri Muni and thereby came to be known as Kaveri. She was married to Agastya and was later transformed into river Kaveri. Kaveri River originates at Talakaveri in Kodagu and is regarded as the presiding Goddess of Kodagu. During the legendary period, some wild and uncivilised tribes apparently lived in Kodagu. For it is said that the goddess Parvati, pleased with the meditation of Chandravarma gave him a sword and a horse and asked him to conquer the land from the wild tribes who were then ruling Kodagu.

Numerous sculptural remains, which have been discovered in the district, have amply demonstrated that man inhabited this district during the pre-historic times. These cairns are similar to such remains found all over south India and indicate that before the dawn of modern civilisation, the same set of people who were dwelling in various parts of south India had their settlements in Kodagu district as well.

The earliest mention of Kodagu is in Tamil literature of the Sangam period. The Tamil poets have described Kudakam, i.e., Kodagu as the western limit of the Pandyan Kingdom. Kodagu from the earliest times known to history up to about the beginning of the 17th century was not ruled by any one dynasty completely. Petty princes & chieftains who owed allegiance to bigger powers outside the district were ruling different parts of Kodagu.

Various inscriptions give the details of history of Kodagu from about 2nd century A.D. to 16th Century A.D. The Gangas ruled from Talkad from 3rd Century A.D. over the southern and central parts of Kodagu

through their governors and local chieftains, the Kadambas of Banavasi, ruled over the northern parts of the district. The Gangas were Jains. Towards the end of 10th Century the Cholas overthrew the Ganga Sovereignty. Then they became the dominant power for a little more than a hundred years.

The Changalvas, the feudatories of the Gangas who were ruling in Hunsur taluk of Mysore district and in Kodagu, opposed the Cholas. The Changalvas are a line of kings who ruled in the western part of Mysore and in Kodagu from the 10th Century to the 17th Century. Though Jains at first, they embarrassed the lingayat faith in the beginning of the 13th century. The Changalvas were defeated in a decisive battle at Hanasoge on the cauvery basin and came under the domination of the Cholas. The Chola suzerainty ended when the Hoysalas of Dwarasamudra overpowered them in 1116 A.D. The Hoysalas exercised over lordship over the Changalva king Mahadeva. Mahadeva shifted his capital from the plains of Hunsur to Palpare in the Kiggatnad of Kodagu. The Hoysala Ballala general, Bettarasa, defeated and killed Mahadeva of the Changalvas in 1174 A.D. in a battle fought at Palpare. Pemma Virappa Changalva attacked Bettarasa in 1174 A.D. Badaganada Nanideva Udayadityadeva of Kuruchi in South Kodagu and the Kodagas of all the nads fought on the side of Pemmavirappa. This is the first specific mention of the Kodavas found in inscriptions. Mudayya Naika, the Kodava general and his two sons died in the battle. But the Kodavas gained a decisive victory for Pemmavirappa who granted lands to the sons of these great fighters. Pemmavirappa submitted to Hoysala Ballala II in 1175 A.D. By about 1245 A.D. The Changalvas had changed their capital from Palpare in South Kodagu to Kodagu Srirangapatna, south of the Kaveri near Siddapur, after defeating the Kongalvas, who governed North Kodagu.

The Hoysalas conquered the Cholas and brought both the Changalvas and Kongalvas under their rule. However, depending upon the strength and weakness of the ruling monarch i.e., the prevailing suzerain, the Changalvas were either loyal or submissive or were rebellions and independent. Muslims from Delhi invaded the south and put an end to the Hoysala rule and to their domination over Kodagu. In the 14th century certain petty chieftains called Nayaka who

were under the influence of the Vijayanagar kings ruled over north Kodagu and Dannayakas (chieftains) ruled over Srimangal and in south Kodagu. These Nayaks were at constant feud with one another which opened the way for the establishment of a new dynasty of rulers, viz, the dynasty of Haleri Rajas.

The Haleri dynasty (1600-1834 A.D.) started ruling over the whole of Kodagu for the first time in the history of Kodagu for 234 years. Vira Raja, a prince of Ikkeri family is the founder of this dynasty. He and his successors subdued the Nayaks and consolidated their power over the present district of Kodagu. Mudduraja-I (1633-1687 A.D.) waged wars against Mysore and the Raja of Chirakkal. He extended his kingdom to Sullia also. During the rule of Chikkavirappa Wodeyar (1736-1766 A.D.) Kodagu attracted the attention of Haidar Ali of Mysore. On the death of Chikkavirappa, there was a dispute about the succession, which gave Haidar Ali an opportunity to intervene in the affairs of Kodagu. Lingaraja (1775-80 A.D.) tried to consolidate his position and occupied parts of Wynad also. But when he died in early 1780 A.D., Haidar Ali occupied Kodagu under the pretense of being the guardian of the young prince. Then began a long struggle which lasted for nine years during which period Tippu Sultan is said to have taken away 70,000 kodava prisoners and in turn tried to populate kodagu with Mohammadens brought from outside. Virarajendra, the rightful king was imprisoned in Piriapatna. In 1788 A.D., Virarajendra escaped from the prison and established friendship with British East India Company. At the conclusion of III Mysore war, Tippu Sultan was forced to hand over Kodagu to the British who restored King Virarajendra to the throne. From then on till 1834 A.D. the Haleri Rajas under the suzerainty of the British ruled Kodagu.

During the rule of Chikkavirarajendra Wodeyar (1820-34 A.D.) serious differences arose between the Raja and the British, and this led to the British taking over the administration directly. The British ruled over Kodagu for 113 years from 1834 to 1947. Kodagu was brought under the administration of the Foreign and Political Department of the Government of India, with the Commissioner of Mysore state as Commissioner of Coorg (Kodagu) also. The

Commissioner had his headquarters at Bangalore while under him the Superintendent was the chief local authority in Coorg. The superintendent was assisted in his work by two Assistant Superintendents, one a European officer and the other a local man. Captain C.F. Wettardy was the first Superintendent of Coorg. Lt. Col. Fraser, the Political Agent and also the Officer in over-all command of the British forces were the first Commissioner. He issued a proclamation that the inhabitants of the state would not again be subjected to native rule and that their civil and religious usages would be respected and that the greatest desire would invariably be shown by the British Government to augment their security and happiness.

The general condition of the people was improved. From the second half of the nineteenth century, the prospect of the country began to change by the large-scale cultivation of coffee in Coorg state. With the advent of Independence in 1947, Kodagu (Coorg) was constituted into a Part-C state in the Union of India. As a consequence of the re-organisation of states in November 1956, Kodagu was merged with the erstwhile state of Mysore (now Karnataka) and was constituted into a separate district with no change in its territorial limits. As the original name of the district has now been restored, the name given to it by the British, namely Coorg is no longer in official use.

(iii) Administrative setup and jurisdictional changes during the decade, 1991-2001

Kodagu district belongs to the southern Malnad Region and is situated on the southwest of Karnataka state, under the Mysore Revenue Division, which is one of the four Revenue Divisions into which the State is organized for the purposes of general administration. There are no major changes in the administrative set up in the district since 1991 Census except that the six out of 9 towns of 1991, viz, Gonikoppal, Kodlipet, Kushalnagar, Ponnampet, Sanivarsante and Suntikoppa were declassified into Grama (village) Panchayats, which were Manadal Panchayats during 1991. However, Gonikoppal and Kushalnagar Grama (village) Panchayaths remained as "Census Towns" during 2001 Census since they satisfied the criteria lay down to treat a place as an urban area.

Total number of Towns/ Villages

The district now consists of one revenue sub-division Madikeri and the three taluks of Madikeri, Somavarpet and Virajpet, comprising in all 296 villages and 5 towns. The 5 towns are Madikeri, Somavarpet, Kushalnagar, Virajpet and Gonikoppal. Out of these 5 towns, 3 are statutory towns and 2 are non-statutory towns (Census Towns). The decrease in the number of towns from 9 to 5 is attributed to declassification of Mandal Panchayats into Grama Panchayats

The areas of the declassified towns are distributed among the concerned revenue villages from which the towns have been constituted earlier. Thus, there is no increase in the number of revenue villages but only increase in rural area while urban areas is converted into rural and decreased.

Though the concept of a revenue village as applicable to the villages of other districts of the state does not fully apply in the case of the villages of

Kodagu district, for the sake of uniformity through out the State and for the purposes of revenue administration, the formerly independent villages with separate village maps and records were periodically rearranged into a lesser number of main villages by grouping up smaller units to form viable units. In 1901, there were 479 inhabited villages and this number became 277 by 1961. The names of such amalgamated villages too were changed in several cases in order to provide an idea about the villages that were merged. However, combined maps were not drawn up by renumbering the survey number in a village and the records were continued to be maintained separately either in separate books or in separate sections in the single book covering the main village as well as its sub-villages. The merged villages were termed as sub-villages and treated as units analogous to the hamlets having no independence existence. The concept of a hamlet as a distinct group of households or a settlement, located at some

distance from the core village settlement area, is not applicable to Kodagu district. The houses in the villages of Kodagu district are generally found to be scattered in small clusters or found to occur as isolated homesteads at places of conveniences all over the revenue land of the villages. This is because of the mountainous and rugged terrain, climatic conditions and socio-cultural traditions in the district. Unlike in the villages of the Maidan region, in the case of the villages of Kodagu district there is no specific area designated as a “gramathana or uru” to indicate the existence of a core settlement. Usually each cluster of houses has a local place name and is easily identifiable through informal enquiries. In some cases, such clusters of houses may be quite large and may cover lands belonging to two or more adjacent revenue villages or sub-villages. In view of the unique feature at the 2001 Census, the population Census data as also the data on amenities and land use were presented in the District Census Handbook for the main villages (inclusive of the sub-villages) only. Since the sub-villages, which have been merged, to form main villages have been treated as hamlets and there are no provisions to present the Census data hamlet wise, for 2001 Census presenting of data sub-village wise/hamlet wise is done away with and not attempted.

For the purposes of development planning and implementation thereof, a Zilla Parishad for Kodagu district and Taluk Panchayats for each one of the 3 taluks of the district have been constituted under the provision of the Zilla Parishad Act 1985. The jurisdiction of each Taluk Panchayats is coterminous with the General administrative jurisdiction of the taluk of the same name but excludes the areas incorporated in the statutory towns or cities located if any, in the taluk concerned. Thus, all villages and also places classified as non-municipal towns (Census Towns) at the 2001 Census come under the jurisdiction of the taluk panchayats. Taluk Panchayats is analogous to the unit more popularly known throughout the country as “Community Development Block”. In order to conform to the All India pattern in the presentation of the 2001 Census data, instead of the term Taluk Panchayat, the term “C.D.Block” has been used at appropriate context in this volume.

The Zilla Parishad elects its President and Vice President and Chairman of its committees from amongst the elected members. The term of office of the members is five years. The State Government as the Chief Executive Officer to the Zilla Parishad

appoints an officer in the senior scale of I.A.S. Various departments also assist the Parishad and the heads of that department at the district level are officers of Class I or II service under the State Government. At the Block level, the Panchayat Samities (C.D.Blocks) have an elected chairman and deputy chairman. The executive authority for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities (C.D.Blocks) Act vests in the Chief Executive Officer.

Urban local bodies

The statutory urban local bodies are the Municipal Corporations and Municipal Councils. These urban local bodies elect Councilors/ Corporators from each ward and the tenure of the Councilors/Corporators would be for five years. The President or Vice-President of the Municipal Council and the Mayor/Deputy Mayor of the Corporations whose tenure will be for a period of one year are elected from among the elected Councilors/Corporators. The Chairman of various committees are also elected from among the elected Councilors for a term of one year.

The Chief Officer in Municipal Council and the Commissioner in a City Corporation are responsible for day-to-day administration and the executive authority is vested with them.

Zilla Panchayat and Taluk Panchayat

To promote the development of institution and secure greater measure of participation by the people in the local and governmental affairs by decentralization of power and functions for the purpose of development, planning and implementation of various programmes thereof Zilla Panchayats have been constituted in the State. The jurisdiction of Zilla Panchayat is coterminous with that of the corresponding district but excludes the statutory towns. Accordingly, Zilla Panchayat has been constituted for Kodagu district and its jurisdiction extends over the Taluk Panchayats of the district. The jurisdiction of each Taluk Panchayat is coterminous with that of the taluk of the same name but excludes the area incorporated in the statutory towns or cities, if any.

The Zilla Panchayat elects its president and vice-president and chairman of its committee from amongst the elected members. The term of these elected representatives will be for five years. An IAS officer is posted by the State Government as Chief Executive Officer of the Zilla Panchayat. Various departments assist the Panchayat.

Grama Panchayats

The Government of Karnataka enacted the Karnataka Panchayat Raj Act 1993 on

30.4.1993 replacing its previous enactment in this regard for the formation of Grama Panchayat.

The Grama Panchayat is authorized to function on the items listed in Schedule I of the Act namely, preparation of annual plans for the development of Panchayat area, preparation of annual budget, providing reliefs in natural calamities, removal of encroachments on public properties, organising voluntary labour and contribution for community works, maintenance of essential statistics of the village, in addition to matters relating to Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Fisheries, Social & Farm Forestry, Khadi, Village & Cottage Industries, Rural Housing, Drinking Water, Roads, etc., Rural Electrification, Non-conventional energy sources, Poverty Alleviation Programmes, Markets & Fairs, Rural Sanitation, Public Health & Family Welfare, Women and Child Development, Social Welfare, Welfare of Weaker Sections, Public Distribution System, Maintenance of Community assets, Construction and Maintenance of Dharmashalas, Chatras, Cattle Sheds, Ponds, Cart Stands, Slaughter Houses, Public Parks, Play Grounds, etc. Regulation of manure pits in public places and establishment and control of shandies. Such other functions as may be entrusted.

The Grama Panchayat is also empowered to make provisions for carrying out within its area any other work or measure which is likely to promote the health, safety, education, comfort, convenience, social or economic well being of the inhabitants of the Panchayat area.

(iv) PHYSICAL FEATURES

Kodagu is a picturesque high land, which is situated on the slopes of the Western Ghats and is clothed with lush greenery of forests and plantations and broken by a few cultivated valleys. The physical features of the districts are varied. The southern,

western and the north-western portions are intersected by a network of hills and dales and are, to a large extent, covered with forests. The landscape on the north-eastern and the eastern portions is different and resembles the plains noticeable in the adjoining Mysore district.

The district has a mountainous configuration, which presents a grand panorama of verdant valleys, rivers, fast-flowing streams, lofty peaks and awe-inspiring spurs. Towards the west, the summit of the Western Ghats attain great heights and the entire western portion of the district is an unbroken chain of hills which appears like a formidable wall from the foot hills on Kerala side. The highest peak of the district is Tadiandamal (1,908 metres Mean Sea Level). Close to this peak there is the lofty Sannamale Mountain, which overlooks the Kodamlora pass and is regarded as a sacred place. From the main chain of hills of the ghats and Begunad ridge numerous ridges just out on either side. The table land of Madikeri maintains an average altitude of about 1,166 metres MSL and slopes down a little to reach 910 metres near Kushalnagar. This plateau is bounded on the west by continuation of the Western Ghats, which culminate near Bisle pass in Pushpagiri hill (about 1,870 metres MSL), which is a remarkable hill of precipitous height and is of a peculiar shape.

The main river in the district is Cauvery (Kaveri), both to size and importance. It rises on the western border from the Brahmagiri peak at a height of about 4,000 feet above the sea level. Flowing in an easterly direction it cuts Kodagu into two halves and traverses through Mysore, Salem, Coimbatore, Tricinapally and Tanjore to a distance of 400 miles before it joins the Bay of Bengal. Its important tributaries are Laxmanathirtha, Kakkabe, Harangi and Hemavathi. The rivers that flow to the west are Barapole, Nojikalhole and Kumaradhari.

Kodagu is one among the smallest districts out of the 27 districts of the State and is comprised of only 3 taluks, which are named after the respective taluk headquarters towns of Madikeri, Somvarpet and Virajpet. There are 5 towns comprising 3 statutory towns and 2 non-statutory towns (Census towns).

(1) Location and size

Kodagu district lies on the summits and the eastern and western slopes of the Western Ghats. It is situated on the southwest of Karnataka State. It lies between North latitude $11^{\circ} 22'$ and $76^{\circ} 11'$ and east longitude $75^{\circ} 22'$ and $76^{\circ} 12'$. Its greatest length from the Hemavathi River in the north to the Brahmagiri range in the south is about 96.56 kms. (60 miles) and the greatest breadth from Sampaje in the west to Kushalnagar in the east is about 64.37 kms. (40 miles). It is bounded on the northwest and the western half of its northern border by Dakshina Kannada district; on the eastern half of its northern border and on the northeast by Hassan district; on the east and the southeastern corner by Mysore district and on the south and the west by the Kerala State. In the northeastern portion of the district, a narrow strip of land measuring about 20 kms. in length and about 10 kms. in breadth projects into Hassan district.

(2) Physiography

Kodagu district is situated in the "Malnad region" of the state under the Mysore revenue division. It is a tiny mountainous province in South India. The Western Ghat Mountains which run along the West Coast of India from Gujarat to Cape Comorin passes through Kodagu. The main range of Western Ghats skirts the southern and western frontier of Kodagu (Coorg). The Brahmagiri peak (5,276 feet) in the extreme south runs in a north-westerly direction till Talakaveri, where it turns east for a few miles before it turns north-west again. It proceeds in the direction for some distance and then runs due north till Pushpagiri Peak (5,260 feet). The Western half of Kodagu to the north of Madikeri is a plateau with an average elevation of 3,500 feet.

(3) Drainage

The main drainage of the district is eastwards. However, there are a few mountain streams of the western declivities on the ghats, which flow westward. The rivers of the district are perennial streams with plentiful supply of water all through the year. The sources of the rivers and streams are high

up in the mountains and these flow through a highly rugged terrain as a result of which these rivers and streams are not suitable either for navigation or for providing water for assured irrigation. Cauvery, Hemavathi, Lakshmanathirtha and Barapole are the important rivers of the district.

(4) Climate

Generally speaking the climate of Kodagu is temperate. The temperature varies from 10 Degree Celsius (50 Degree Fahrenheit) in December to about 32.22 Degree Celsius (90 Degree Fahrenheit) in the month of April. Though the climate of Kodagu is quite pleasant and healthy, high humidity, heavy to very heavy rainfall and a cool summer characterize it. A major part of the year consists of the rainy season as the monsoon period starting in June lasts till the end of September. Even during the post-monsoon months of October and November certain parts of the district receive a significant amount of rainfalls. The period from December to February constitutes the cold season marked by a bright weather, the foggy mornings and cool nights. The intensity of cold increases in areas closer to the forest zones and in the hilly tracts. Madikeri town is located on a hill and is well known for its chilly weather. The day temperature begins to rise sharply during March and marks the commencement of the summer season which lasts till the end of May. Sporadic mild showers, locally known as blossom showers, occur in all parts of the district during March. Occasionally heavy showers preceded by winds of high velocity and thunderstorms occur during the months of May.

(5) Winds

The winds are light to moderate with some strong winds during the southwest monsoon months. During this season, the winds blow mainly between the southwest and northwest directions. In the post-monsoon season, winds are mainly northeasterly or easterly but on some days, it blows northwesterly in the afternoons. During the rest of the year winds blow from directions between north and east in the mornings and between southwest and northwest in the afternoons.

(6) Rainfall pattern

The south-west monsoon usually sets in during the early part of June. Generally, June, July and August are the months of heavy rainfall. The precipitation in July, in particular, is incessant and very heavy. The average rainfall for the district is 2,865

mm per annum and on an average, there are about 121 rainy days in a year. However, the amount of rainfall as also the number of rainy days varies considerably within the district. The weather conditions of the district are well suited for the cultivation of paddy in the valleys and for raising plantation crops like coffee, cardamom and orange on the slopes of hills and mountains.

The District falls under hilly agro climatic zones of the state. All the three taluks under the district i.e., Madikeri, Somvarpet and Virajpet falls under hilly zone. The average Rainfall in the district ranges from 2,185 mm in Somvarpet taluk to 3,263 mm in Madikeri taluk. The rainfall decreases from south-eastern part of the district towards north and north-western part.

The northern part of Somvarpet taluk receives the lowest rainfall.

Among the taluks in the district the premonsoon rainfall contributes 8 to 11 per cent of the annual rainfall, southwest monsoon contributes 77 to 83 per cent and northeast monsoon contributes 9 to 12 per cent of the annual rainfall.

The coefficient of variation ranges from 45 to 54 per cent for the pre-monsoon season, the highest variability (54 per cent) being in the taluk of Somvarpet.

The coefficient of variation for southwest monsoon ranges from 22 to 27 per cent. The coefficient of variation for northeast monsoon ranges from 40 to 43 per cent, the highest being for Virajpet taluk.

The coefficient of variation for Annual rainfall ranges from 19 to 23 per cent.

A study of the rainfall deficit pattern during the last 20 years compared with the long term data for different seasons indicate increase in rainfall deficiency in the recent past during the pre-monsoon

and northeast monsoon period. Rainfall deficit during last 20 years has been compared with that of long term data in different seasons and is presented below.

Following inferences could be made:

- * The Pre-monsoon rainfall in the recent 20 years is more deficit compared to the long term data.
- * Southwest monsoon is fewer deficits in the recent 20 years compared to the long-term data with Virajpet taluk as an exception.
- * The rainfall deficit during northeast monsoon is increasing during recent 20 years compared to the long-term data.
- * The annual rainfall trend analysis indicates no significant change in the taluk of Madikeri and Somvarpet. The taluks of Virajpet indicates decreasing trend.

(7) Forestry

The total forest area of the district is 134,597 hectares, which is 32.77 per cent of the total geographical area. The forests of Kodagu form the most valuable asset of the district, the income from which is several times higher the land revenue. The reserve forest of the district is considered to be one of the richest and most valuable forests in India. The reserve forest consists of three regions. Majority of the area is classified as Protective and Climatic forests in areas of torrential rainfall in the Western Ghats form first region, Timber forests of great potential economic value capable of growing hard woods such as teak is second region and the third region contains valuable sandalwood bearing area. The climatic and protective forests, which constitute about 60.00 per cent of the total forest in the district, where tree felling are not permitted so that forests in the areas are kept absolutely intact, with a primary object of the management of this forest is to protect and safeguard the region.

(8) Geology

Geologically, the district consists of recent and sub-recent formations. Lateritic soils, dolerite dykes, charnockites, granites and Dharwar gneisses. Thin veins of quartz and pigmatities traverse the granitic areas. This is so especially in the eastern and southern sectors of the district. Dolerite dykes occur as detached boulders, and at places, intrude the granitic formations. A thick mantle of fertile soil while the elevated portions cover the flat and low-lying areas and hills are capped with laterite. The river sections contain sand, silt and gravel in varying proportions. A systematic and thorough geological survey has not so far been carried out in the district as a unit. The district has not witnessed any geographical change in recent years. On completion

of the Harangi Project, a large artificial lake has come up in the eastern sector near Igoor village of Somvarpet Taluk.

(9) Flora and Fauna

Flora : The flora of Kodagu district has an invaluable treasure of timber trees and their produce, scattered all over the district. There are two distinct tracts in the district with trees peculiar to them. The people call the forests in Kodagu as Male-Kadu or hill forests and Kanive-Kadu or hillock jungles. Botanically, they can be called as evergreen and deciduous forests, the former clothing the high ghats and the latter the eastern hill tracts. About one-third of the total geographical area of the district is classified as forest. The principal timber species found in the evergreen forests of Kodagu are Agil, Aini, Hebhalsu, Krupu, Kiral bogi, Kalpaina, Chonapaini, Yenu-mara, Velthapaini, Dupa, pali, Nandi, Honne, Teak, Beeti (Rose wood), Jack, Mathi, etc. Species of secondary importance found in this region are the Perumara, Kat-Kumbala, Palmani, Karpamara, Gerumara, Choremara, Bage mara, etc. The species commonly found in the eastern forests are the Adale, Alale, Ambatte, Aralimara, Arasinatega, Bage, Basrimara, Srigandhada mara, Gantimara etc. There are large clumps of bamboos in the eastern part of Kodagu. Minor forest produce of the district consists of tamarind, myrobalam, soapnut, tanning barks, horns, bee wax, honey, gums, honge seeds, lichens and nux vomica.

The picturesque scenery of the forests and the bamboo clusters of Kodagu have somewhat been marked on account of the indiscriminate felling of the trees and bamboos. The Government through its Department of Forests has taken a number of measures to protect the forests and the indiscriminate felling of trees in the area.

Fauna: The forests of the district have been providing a good cover as well as food and fodder to a variety of animals and birds. The fauna of Kodagu district is not very different from that of the adjoining districts, but on account of the shelter the hills and thick jungles of Kodagu offer and the availability of plenty of drinking water, their number in the district is larger. The whole of Kodagu is rich in fauna because of the dense forests and evergreen valleys. During the period of heavy rains (monsoon) the beasts of prey move over to the adjoining tracts to escape the fury of monsoons. The bigger beasts of prey are normally found in the regions where there are streams and the topography is not too steep or precipitous as in the case of the extreme west. The northern, eastern and southern regions are full of all kinds of animals. The carnivorous animals found in considerable numbers are the tigers, panthers, wild bears and bears besides the tiger cats, civet cats, porcupine, etc. Of the non-carnivorous type, the elephant and the bison are the most important. Elephants are largely found in the Nagarhole and Thithmathi ranges that are in the southeastern and eastern sectors, on the borders of Wynad of Kerala and Mysore district of Karnataka. The next of the larger species to elephant is bison (called Kati), which is commonly found in the reserve forest tracts. Bison is a ferocious animal that moves about within the district throughout the year and attacks when alarmed or provoked. Sambar, spotted deer, barking deer, rabbits, monkeys, wild-dogs, etc., are very common in the forests of Kodagu. In the reptile class, the most common is the cobra. In the dense jungles, the king cobra is also found. The krait and the python exist all over the forest area.

A variety of birds with pleasing colours and beautiful plumage adorn the skies of the district. Among the birds of prey, the soaring vultures and the eagles are found in the jungles. The kite is a common bird in Kodagu. The Malbar togon, a variety of parrots, woodpeckers, black cuckoo, and the red-winged crested cuckoo, the Nilgiri-black-bird (also called the nightingale of Kodagu), mynah and numerous other types of birds are found here. Peacocks are normally found in the bamboo jungles. Soon after the monsoon birds arrive in thousands, the honeybee is an asset of Kodagu that has been supporting a thriving industry for decades. The

butterflies, moths and spiders are present in large numbers in Kodagu district. There are several kinds of crabs. The leeches, called Jigani, are active during the monsoon months and those who frequent the forests know their nuisance value.

Game laws have been formed and are strictly enforced with a view to preserve the wild life. Under the Elephant Preservation Act, 1879, no elephant could be shot except with a special license obtained from the Government. Similarly for the protection of species of tigers, Government enacted laws to prevent their extinction. Likewise, shooting of parrots, birds of bright plumage and those known for pleasant tunes and singing, Malabar squirrel, young stock of pigeon, spotted deer, barking deer and antelope is totally prohibited. It is well known, that the Government had taken a conscious and concerted efforts to preserve the natural wealth with which the district is endowed. Kodavas alias Coorgs the predominant community of Kodagu, have a martial tradition and, hunting had for long been incorporated into their way of life. They have adjusted themselves admirably to the various enactments, which have been contemplated for the preservation of the wild life and the nature's bounty.

(10) Soils

The soils of the district are of heterogeneous profile and consist of lateritic debris found in different stages of weathering and laterization. The valleys and slope have fertile red loamy soil that is suitable for cultivation. In the eastern zone dark clay soils are predominant whereas in the central zone loamy soils are predominant and in the western zone the soil is highly leached and are being lateritic in content, tends to be very shallow.

(11) Cropping pattern

Out of the 410,775 hectares land of the district 134,597 hectares are covered with the forests. According to the latest statistical data available, 54,701 hectares of land are not available for cultivation and 67,597 hectares are not cultivated. It is only in 141,713 hectares of land that cultivation has taken place during the year 1998-99. That is about 34.50 per cent of area of the district are under cultivation.

The land holdings for the year 1995-96 of different size are shown in the above table. The size of the agriculture agricultural holdings is one of the important factors that determine the productivity of the land. From the above table, it is

observed that the number of marginal holdings below one hectare and small holdings of size one to two is high which constitute about 64.00 per cent of the total holdings. Only 1,892 holders own land more than 10 hectares.

The major cultivation crops grown during the year 1998-99 in the district are; Paddy in 40,666 hectares and Ragi in 425 hectares. In about 1,495 hectares of land Maize was grown. Thus, in about 42,586 hectares of land cultivation crops were grown. The major plantation crops grown in all over the district are coffee, cardamom, pepper, areca nut, coconut, tea and orange.

Paddy is grown extensively in all regions of the district and it is the staple food of Kodagu. Ragi is grown in Somvarpet taluk of the district. The plantation crop coffee, cardamom, pepper, etc., are mainly grown for commercial purposes and are the main backing of the economy of the people of this area. The paddy crop in the district is purely a rain fed one with nearly 50% of the area under this crop is in Virajpet taluk. Cultivation of coffee, is equally important to that of paddy. Among the plantation crops, coffee stands first. Cultivation of this crop is done on scientific lines. Two principle species of coffee grown are Arabica and Robusta. Arabica is grown in 25,887 hectares and Robusta is grown in 53,980 hectares. The production of Arabica and Robusta are 32,300 Metric Tons (MT) and 71,600 Metric Tons (MT) respectively*. Cardamom grown both wild and is also reared. Among the fruit, the coorg oranges (Mandarin) are famous for its flavour

and superior quality; attractive appearance and the deep orange colour. Its sugar and acid contents are well blended. The orange cultivation, though in all parts of Kodagu was done in earlier decades, recently, the cultivation of this crop is diminishing significantly; the reason better known to the people themselves. Dry crops like ragi, corn (maize), avare, hurali and others are chiefly grown on the western banks of Cauvery. Tea and rubber are also grown to some extent. The table given above explains the area, production and yield and the principal crops and other crops for the year 1998-99 in the district.

The agricultural season in the district commences with the onset of southwest monsoon when preparatory cultivation begins in the wetlands. The only season that is very important for farming practices is the kharif season, the duration of which is from May to December. Rabi crops are mainly grown in Somvarpet and Madikeri taluks only, in a small area between January and April. The paddy crop harvesting time will be the end of December and the threshing work continues till the end of February, which marks the end of the agricultural season in Kodagu. During the same period, the harvesting of the principal plantation crops like coffee,

cardamom, pepper and orange will be mostly over. The harvesting of Robusta coffee, which starts from about the middle of January, continues till the end of March.

(12) Irrigation

The main drainage pattern of Coorg is in an easterly direction towards the Bay of Bengal, while a few mountain torrents flow west from the Western Ghats towards the Arabian Sea. The rivers are not noticed either for their width or for depth, but their water supply is abundant. As the sources of the rivers are high up in the mountains and as their courses lie

over steep declivities, they flow with great rapidity over rocky beds. Owing to the height of their banks and the unevenness of the place, few of them are used for irrigation purposes. Except for a few small tanks situated in different parts of the district and some streams and springs, there are no facilities for an assured water supply for irrigation. The taluk wise details for the sources of irrigation and the area covered for the year 1998-99 is given in the table mentioned below.

The total area irrigated during the year 1998-99 was 3,094 hectares as per the published figures available from the district Statistical Office, Kodagu district. Out of 3,094 hectares, 2,047 hectares are irrigated by canals which is found only in Somvarpet taluk, 81 hectares by tanks, 28 hectares by well and 938 hectares by other sources like lift irrigation, etc.

Few irrigation projects that sprang up in the district have paved the way for an assured water supply to augment the agricultural production. Among them, Harangi Reservoir project is worth mentioning in the district. This project was approved by the Govt. in 1986. This project comprises of a reservoir across the river Harangi a tributary to the river Cauvery, near Hudgur village in Somvarpet taluk. With canals on both banks, it is expected to provide irrigation to an extent of 53,591 hectares in Kodagu, Hassan and Mysore districts. The dam is 846 metres long and 46.94 metres high with a storage capacity of 240.69 Million Cubic metres (Mcum). It has submerged an extent of 1,909 hectares of land affecting 13 villages/hamlets. There are two canals and two lift irrigation schemes under this project. The Left Canal Bank and Right will provide irrigation to 53,591 hectares. The work is nearing completion.

Kodagu will also be benefited by the other major project approved by the government. The project

approved is Hemavathy Project Zone, Gorur in the Hassan taluk of Hassan district.

Chicklihole is another medium irrigation project commenced in the year 1978. This project comprises of a reservoir across Chicklihole, a tributary to the river Cauvery near Rangasamudra village in Somvarpet taluk. With flow canals on both banks, the project will provide irrigation to an extent of 865 hectares in the taluk. It has submerged an extent of 107 hectares area without affecting any village. The work is under progress.

13) Natural Wealth

No systematic mineral survey of the district has been conducted, but selected portions have been surveyed. Kodagu district is not noted for any richness of economic mineral deposits. There are a few deposits of Mica, Kyanite, Iron ore and Clay. The mica is found near Kushalnagar, near Marenad and Parakatageri and also about two miles west of Madikeri. Kyanite in the form of small knots is found on the eastern slopes and western flanks of the mound near Katakari village near Madikeri. It is also found near Siddapur. The granites, gneisses and Charnockites form excellent material for building purposes and as road ballast. The pink porphyritic granites take an excellent polish and are used for building and decorative purposes. The following table gives the taluk wise mineral resources.

(14) Animal Husbandry

Livestock rearing plays very vital role in rural economy in supplementing family income from agriculture and also providing employment. It is more active wherever agriculture is predominant in the society. Farmers are dependent on animal husbandry activities to utilize agricultural by-products and crop residues to convert them into

animal products with good returns. According to livestock Census (Provisional figures) 1997, the total livestock population of the district is 288,589, which includes cattle, Buffaloes, Sheep, Goats, Pigs, Rabbit, Dogs and other livestock. Total poultry population 333,006. The following table shows the distribution of various types of livestock in the district for the year 1997.

The milk production in the district is 51 thousand tons, 363 lakhs of eggs and 830 tons of meat is produced annually.

There are eleven livestock farms under the control of the Department of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary services in the State. Out of these, one station namely, Jercy Cattle Breeding Station, Kudige is in the district. This station is engaged in Jercy Cattle Breeding, bull-calf production, farmer's training, fodder development and pig development.

There are thirty-two poultry institution functioning in the State. Of these one District Poultry Rearing and Training Centre at Kudige and a Poultry Rearing Centre at Ponnampet are functioning in the

district. The swine breeding policy of the State aims at usage of exotic breeds of pigs like Landrace and Yorkshine. On the whole there are three Pig Breeding station functioning in the State. Of which, one is stationed at Kudige in Kodagu district.

The demand for Rabbit meat is mounting and to meet this demand, the department has started nine breeding centers in the State and one center is stationed at Kudige.

(14A) Veterinary Services

The spread of Veterinary services has related to overall improvement of animal health. The district has 74 Veterinary institutions for the year 2000. The details are as follows :

(16) Industries

Though Kodagu is agriculturally prosperous, in its industrial potentiality, it is still considered to be a backward district in the State. The role of manufacturing industry in the economy of the district is minimal. There are no large-scale industries in the district. The industrial units in the district comprise of few rice mills, couple of saw

mills, printing presses both private and government, the government run-central workshop and few engineering and automobile repair workshops. There are also few household industries in the district. There are totally forty factories giving employment to 3,082 persons in the district. The table below indicates the taluk wise details of factories in the district.

(17) Trade and Commerce

Trading and commercial activities are by and large confined to a few urban centers, which mainly import consumer goods from larger wholesale centres beyond the district to cater to the needs of the local people. In the overall economy of the district, the share of its sector is not quite

impressive. The chief items of export are Coffee, Cardamom, Pepper, Oranges, Rubber, Timber, Honey etc. The district has 91 commercial banks, 19 Grameena banks, 3 Urban Co-operative banks, 3 Regional Land Development bank and one other Cooperative bank. The taluk wise details are given in the table below.

(19) Electricity and Power

Karnataka has a place of pride in the field of power generation in the country. KPTCL – Karnataka Power Transmission Corporation Limited (erstwhile KEB) is mainly vested with the functions of transmission and distribution of power in the entire state. The Corporation has been attaching great importance to electrification of villages and hamlets,

tribal colonies and harijan basthis and energisation of irrigation pump sets. Besides, this with a view to benefit weakest among the section of society schemes called Bhagya Jyothi / Kutir Jyothi have been introduced.

(v) CENSUS CONCEPT

Building

A 'Building' is generally a single structure on the ground. Sometimes it is made up of more than one component unit which are used or likely to be used as dwellings (residences) or establishments such as shops, business houses, offices, factories, workshops, worksheds, Schools, places of entertainment, places of worship, godowns, stores etc. It is also possible that building which have component units may be used for a combination of purposes such as shop-cum-residence, workshop-cum-residence, office-cum-residence, etc.

Usually a structure will have four walls and a roof. But in some areas the very nature of construction of houses is such that there may not be any wall. Such is the case of conical structures where entrance is also provided but they may not have any walls. Therefore, such of the conical structures are also treated as separate buildings.

Permanent houses

Houses, the walls and roof of which are made of permanent materials. The material of walls can be any one from the following, namely, galvanized iron sheets or other metal sheets, asbestos sheets, burnt bricks, stones or concrete. Roof may be made of from any one of the following materials, namely, tiles, slate, galvanized iron sheets, metal sheets, asbestos sheets, bricks, stones or concrete.

Semi-permanent houses

Houses in which either the wall or the roof is made of permanent material and the other is made of temporary material.

Temporary houses

Houses in which both walls and roof are made of materials, which have to be replaced frequently. Walls may be made from any one of the following temporary materials, namely, grass, thatch, bamboo, plastic, polythene, mud, unburnt bricks or wood. Roof

may be made from any one of the following temporary materials, namely, grass, thatch, bamboo, wood, mud, plastic or polythene.

Dwelling Room

A room is treated as a dwelling room if it has walls with a doorway and a roof and should be wide and long enough for a person to sleep in, i.e. it should have a length of not less than 2 meters and a breadth of at least 1.5 meters and a height of 2 meters. A dwelling room would include living room, bedroom, dining room, drawing room, study room, servant's room and other habitable rooms. Kitchen, bathroom, latrine, store room, passage-way and verandah which are not normally usable for living are not considered as dwelling rooms. A room, used for multipurpose such as sleeping, sitting, dining, storing, cooking, etc., is regarded as a dwelling room. In a situation where a census house is used as a shop or office., etc., and the household also stays in it then the room is not considered as a dwelling room. But if a garage or servant quarter is used by a servant and if she/ he also lives in it as a separate household then this has been considered as a dwelling room available to the servant's household. Tent or conical shaped hut if used for living by any household is also considered as dwelling room.

A dwelling room, which is shared by more than one household, has not been counted for any of them. If two households have a dwelling room each but in addition also share a common dwelling room, then the common room has not been counted for either of the households.

Census House

A 'census house' is a building or part of a building used or recognised as a separate unit because of having a separate main entrance from the road or common courtyard or staircase, etc. It may be occupied or vacant. It may be used for residential or non residential purpose or both.

In certain peculiar situations, the manner in which buildings and census houses were identified for numbering in the field by the enumerators is described hereunder:

Sometimes a series of different buildings are found along a street which are joined with one another by common walls on either side looking like a continuous

structure. These different units are practically independent of one another and are likely to have been built at different times and owned by different persons. In such cases, though the whole structure with all the adjoining units apparently appears to be one building, each portion was treated as a separate building and its constituent units as separate census houses.

On the other hand, one may come across cases, particularly in large cities of multistoreyed ownership flats. In these cases while the structure looks like one building, different persons own the flats. In case of such multistoreyed structures, having a number of flats owned by different persons, the entire structure was treated as one building and each flat as a separate census house.

If within a large enclosed area, there are separate buildings owned by different persons then each such building is treated as a separate building. There can be a situation where within an enclosed compound there are separate buildings owned by an undertaking or company or even government that are actually in occupation of different persons. For example, Indian Oil Corporation colony where the buildings are owned by the Corporation but these are in occupation of their employees. Each such building was treated as a separate building. But if in any one of these buildings there were flats in occupation of different households, each such flat was reckoned as a separate census house.

Sometimes it becomes difficult to apply the definition of census house strictly in certain cases. For example, in an urban area, if a flat has five rooms, each room having direct entrance from the common staircase or courtyard, by definition, this has to be treated as five census houses. If all these five rooms are occupied by a single household it was not realistic to treat them as five census houses. In such a case, 'singleness' of use of these rooms along with the main house should be considered and the entire flat was treated as one census house. On the other hand, if two independent households occupy these five rooms, the first household living in 3 rooms and the second household occupying 2 rooms, then considering the use, the first three rooms together were treated as one census house and the remaining rooms as another census house. But if each room

was occupied by an independent household, then each such room was treated as a separate census house.

In case of hostels, hotels, etc., even if the door of each room in which an inmate lives opens to a common verandah, staircase, courtyard or a common room, as it happens almost invariably, the entire hostel/Hotel building was treated as one census house. But if such hostels/ hotels have out houses or other structures used for different purposes or the same purpose, then each such structure attached to the main hostel / hotel was treated as a separate census house.

In some parts of the country, in rural areas, the pattern of habitation is such that a group of huts, located in a compound, whether enclosed or unenclosed, is occupied by one household. While the main residence may be located in one hut, other huts may be used for sleeping, as a kitchen, bath room, baithak, etc. Though each of the huts was a separate structure, they form a single housing unit and therefore, have to be treated collectively as one building and one census house. If some of the huts are used by one household and the others by a second household as residence, then the two groups of huts were treated as separate census houses. However, if there were also other huts in the compound used for other purposes and not as part of the household's residence such as, cattle shed, workshed, etc., these were treated as separate census houses.

On the other hand, in urban areas, where more than one structure within an enclosed or open compound (premises) belonging to the same person, e.g., the main house, the servant's quarter, the garage, etc., only one building number was given for this group and each of the constituent a separate census house number.

Only cases where a structure with roof and pillars has come up was treated as a building.

Village

The basic unit for rural areas is the revenue village which has definite surveyed boundaries. The revenue village may comprise of one or more hamlets but the entire village is treated as one unit for presentation of data. In unsurveyed areas, like villages within forest areas, each habitation area with locally recognized boundaries is treated as one village.

Rural-Urban area

The data in tables on Houses, Household Amenities and Assets are presented separately for rural and urban areas. The unit of classification in this regard is 'town' for urban areas and 'village' for rural areas. In the Census of India 2001, the definition of urban area adopted is as follows:

- a) All places with a municipality, corporation, cantonment board or notified town area committee, etc.
- b) A place satisfying the following three criteria simultaneously:
 - i) A minimum population of 5,000;
 - ii) At least 75 per cent of male working population engaged in non-agricultural pursuits; and
 - iii) a density of population of at least 400 per sq. km.(1,000 per sq.mile)

For identification of places which would qualify to be classified as 'urban' all villages, which, as per the 1991 Census had a population of 4,000 and above, a population density of 400 persons per sq. km. and having at least 75 per cent of male working population engaged in nonagricultural activity were considered. To work out the proportion of male working population referred to above against b) (ii), the data relating to main workers were taken into account.

Apart from these, the outgrowths (OGs) of cities and towns have also been treated as urban under 'Urban Agglomerations'. Examples of outgrowths are railway colonies, university campuses, port areas, military camps, etc., that may have come up near a statutory town or city but within the revenue limits of a village or villages contiguous to the town or city. Each such individual area by itself may not satisfy the demographic criteria laid down at (b) above to qualify it to be treated as an independent urban unit but may deserve to be clubbed with the towns as a continuous urban spread. Thus, the town level data, wherever presented, also includes the data for outgrowths of such towns.

City

Towns with population of 100,000 and above are called cities.

Urban Agglomeration

An Urban Agglomeration is a continuous urban spread constituting a town and its adjoining urban outgrowths (OGs) or two or more physically contiguous towns together and any adjoining urban outgrowths of such towns. In some cases railway colonies, university campuses, port areas, etc., may come up near a city or statutory town outside its statutory limits but within the revenue limits of a village or villages contiguous to the town or city. Each such individual area by itself may not satisfy the minimum population limit to qualify it to be treated as an independent urban unit but may deserve to be clubbed with the town as a continuous urban spread.

For the purpose of delineation of Urban Agglomerations during Census of India 2001, following criteria are taken as pre-requisites:

(a) The core town or at least one of the constituent towns of an urban agglomeration should necessarily be a statutory town; and

(b) The total population of all the constituents (i.e., towns and outgrowths) of an Urban Agglomeration should not be less than 20,000 (as per the 1991 Census).

With these two basic criteria having been met, the following are the possible different situations in which Urban Agglomerations would be constituted:

i) a city or town with one or more contiguous outgrowths;

ii) two or more adjoining towns with their outgrowths; and

iii) a city and one or more adjoining towns with their outgrowths all of which form a continuous spread.

Household

A 'household' is usually a group of persons who normally live together and take their meals from a common kitchen unless the exigencies of work prevent any of them from doing so. Persons in a household may be related or unrelated or a mix of both. However, if a group of unrelated persons live in a census house but do not take their meals from the common kitchen, then they are not constituent of a common household. Each such person was to be treated as a separate household. The important link

in finding out whether it was a household or not was a common kitchen. There may be one member households, two member households or multimember households.

Institutional Household

A group of unrelated persons who live in an institution and take their meals from a common kitchen is called an Institutional Household. Examples of Institutional Households are boarding houses, messes, hostels, hotels, rescue homes, jails, ashrams, orphanages, etc. To make the definition more clearly perceptible to the enumerators at the Census 2001, it was specifically mentioned that this category of households would cover only those households where a group of unrelated persons live in an institution and share a common kitchen.

Houseless Household

Households who do not live in buildings or census houses but live in the open on roadside, pavements, in hume pipes, under flyovers and staircases, or in the open in places of worship, mantaps, railway platforms, etc., are treated as Houseless Households.

Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes

Article 341 of the Constitution provides that the President may, with respect to any State or Union territory, specify the castes, races or tribes or parts of or groups within castes, races or tribes which shall for the purposes of the Constitution be deemed to be Scheduled Castes in relation to that State or Union territory. Article 342 similarly provides for specification of tribes or tribal communities or parts of or groups within tribes or tribal communities which are to be deemed for the purposes of the Constitution to be Scheduled Tribes in relation to the various States and Union territories. In pursuance of these provisions, the list of Scheduled Castes and / or Scheduled Tribes are notified for each State and Union territory and are valid only within the jurisdiction of that State or Union territory and not outside.

It is important to mention here that under the Constitution (Scheduled Castes) Order, 1950, no person who professed a religion different from Hinduism was deemed to be a member of a Scheduled Caste in addition to every member of the Ramdasi, Kabirpanthi, Majhabi or Sikligar caste resident in Punjab or Patiala and East Punjab States

Union were in relation to that State whether they professed the Hindu or the Sikh religion. Subsequently, in September 1956, by an amendment, the Presidential Order of 1950 and in all subsequent Presidential Orders relating to Scheduled Castes, the Hindu and the Sikh religions were placed on the same footing with regard to the specification of Scheduled Castes. Later on, as per the amendment made in the Constitution (Scheduled Castes) Order 1990, the Hindu, the Sikh and the Buddhist were placed on the same footing with regard to the recognition of the Scheduled Castes.

The list of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes are notified for each State and Union Territory and are valid only within the jurisdiction of that State or Union Territory and not outside. In respect of Karnataka State the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes as contained in the Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes Orders (Amendment) Act, 1976 are valid for the purpose of Census of India, 2001. With the promulgation of Act 39 of 1991 however, the sub entries Naik, Nayak, Beda, Bedar and Valmiki were added under the main entry at S.No. 38 (Naikda, Nayaka,) of the Scheduled Tribes list of the State. There are in all 101 Scheduled Castes and 49 Scheduled Tribes in the State which are listed below:

Language and Mother tongue

As per the Census concept, each language is a group of mother tongues. The census questionnaire collects information on the mother tongue of each person and mother tongue is defined as the language spoken in childhood by the person's mother to the person. If the mother died in infancy, the language mainly spoken in the person's home in childhood will be the mother tongue. In the case of infants and deaf mutes, the language usually spoken by the mother is considered as mother tongue. It is not necessary that the language spoken as mother tongue should have a script. The mother tongues returned by the respondents in census are classified and grouped under appropriate languages according to their linguistic characteristics.

Literate

A person aged 7 years and above who can both read and write with understanding in any language is taken as literate. A person who can only read but cannot write is not literate. It is not necessary that to be considered as literate, a person should have received any formal education or passed any minimum educational standard. Literacy could also have been achieved through adult literacy classes or through any non-formal educational system. People who are blind and can read in Braille are treated as literates.

Literacy rate

Literacy rate of the population is defined as the percentage of literates in the age group seven years and above. For different age groups the percentage of literates in that age group gives the literacy rate.

Educational level

The highest level of education a person has completed.

Work

Work is defined as participation in any economically productive activity with or without

compensation, wages or profit. Such participation may be physical and/or mental in nature. Work involves not only actual work but also includes effective supervision and direction of work. It even includes part time help or unpaid work on farm, family enterprise or in any other economic activity. All persons engaged in 'work' as defined above are workers. Persons who are engaged in cultivation or milk production even solely for domestic consumption are also treated as workers.

Reference period for determining a person as worker and non-worker is one year preceding the date of enumeration.

Main worker

A person who has worked for major part of the reference period (i.e. six months or more during the last one year preceding the date of enumeration) in any economically productive activity is termed as 'Main worker' .

Marginal worker

A person who worked for less than six months of the reference period (i.e. in the last one year preceding the date of enumeration) in any economic activity is termed as 'Marginal worker' .

Non-worker

A person who has not worked at all in any economically productive activity during the reference period (i.e. last one year preceding the date of enumeration) is termed as 'Non worker' .

Cultivator

For purposes of the Census a person is classified as cultivator if she or he is engaged in cultivation on land owned or held from government or held from private persons or institutions for payment in money, kind or share. Cultivation includes effective supervision or direction in cultivation.

A person who has given out her/his land to another person or persons or institution(s) for cultivation for money, kind or share of crop and who does not even supervise or direct cultivation in exchange of land, is not treated as cultivator. Similarly, a person working on another person's land for wages in cash or kind or a combination of both (agricultural labourer) is not treated as cultivator.

Cultivation involves ploughing, sowing, harvesting and production of cereals and millet crops such as

wheat, paddy, jowar, bajra, ragi, etc., and other crops such as sugarcane, tobacco, groundnuts, tapioca, etc., and pulses, raw jute and kindred fiber crop, cotton, cinchona and other medicinal plants, fruit growing, vegetable growing or keeping orchards or groves, etc. Cultivation does not include the following plantation crops – tea, coffee, rubber, coconut and betelnuts (areca).

Agricultural labourer

A person who works on another person's land for wages in cash or kind or share is regarded as an agricultural labourer. She/he has no risk in the cultivation, but merely works on another person's land for wages. An agricultural labourer has no right of lease or contract on land on which she/he works.

Household industry worker

Household industry is defined as an industry conducted by the head of the household herself/himself and or by the members of the household at home or within the village in rural areas and only within the precincts of the house where the household lives in urban areas. The larger proportion of workers in household industry should consist of members of the household including the head. The industry should not be run on the scale of a registered factory which would qualify or has to be registered under the Indian Factories Act and should be engaged in manufacturing, processing, servicing and repairs of goods. A person who has been engaged in the economic activity like above is termed as Household Industry Worker.

It does not include professions such as a pleader, Doctor, Musician, Dancer, Waterman, Astrologer, Dhobi, Barber, etc. or merely trade or business, even if such professions, trade or services are run at home by members of the household.

Other worker

A person who has been engaged in some economic activity during the reference period but not as a cultivator or agricultural labourer or in Household Industry is termed as an 'Other Worker (OW)'. The type of workers that come under this category of 'OW' include all government servants, municipal employees, teachers, factory workers, plantation workers, those engaged in trade, commerce, business, transport, banking, mining, construction, political or social work, priests, entertainment artists, etc. In

effect, all those workers other than cultivators or agricultural labourers or household industry workers, are 'Other Workers'.

Work participation rate

Percentage of workers (main + marginal) to total population.

Population density

Population density is the number of persons inhabited per square kilometer of the area.

Age

Age is measured in terms of the completed number of years.

Sex ratio

Number of females per 1,000 males in a population.

(vi) NON-CENSUS CONCEPTS

Improved drinking water

If the household had access to drinking water supplied from a tap, hand pump, tube well or well (protected or covered) situated within or outside the premises, it is considered as having access to improved drinking water.

It may be mentioned that such uniform definition may not be valid across all states.

System of sewerage

Generally, a sewerage system would mean a network of mains and branches of underground conduits for the conveyance of sewerage to the point of disposal. Sewers that carry only household and industrial wastage are called separate sewers; those that carry storm water from roofs, streets and other surfaces are known as storm water drains, while those carrying both sewage and storm water are called combined sewers. However, in some towns which are not provided with such underground sewerage system, it is served by open surface drain, box drain, sylk pattern drain, etc., in these towns.

Type of latrine and Method of disposal of night soil

There are three prevalent systems of disposal of human wastes, viz.(i) underground sewerage, (ii) sanitary water flush latrines with individual disposal systems, like septic tank, leaching cess pool and

collecting well, and (iii) dry type of latrines with manual scavenging.

The system of underground sewerage provides for the street sewerage with which are connected the sanitary latrines constructed in the houses having water closets and fitted with flushing cistern (or hand flushing). Through this sewer the faecal matter is transported without the need for scavenging. This system generally exists in cities and big towns.

Where the streets sewer does not exist these sanitary water flush latrines are connected to a local septic tank with a subsoil dispersion system or a leaching pit. Here the liquid wastes from the water closet is disposed of locally in leaching pit, a septic tank with a soil dispersion system is constructed. This dispersion requires an optimum travel through the pores of the soil which renders the harmful liquid bacterially innocuous by the slow process of filtration through the soil traversed.

Where the soil is impermeable, collecting wells are constructed and the sanitary water flush latrines are connected with them. These wells are cleaned at periodic intervals by a suitable device. The dry type of latrines are of service type latrines from where human excreta is removed by scavengers from house to house, in most cases carrying it on their heads or shoulders or in baskets with handle or wheel barrows. These are then collected in bullock carts or trucks or tractors and trolleys for being carried to the dumping grounds.

Fertility

In demography, the word fertility is used in relation to the actual production of children or occurrence of births specially live births. Fertility is a measure of rate at which population adds to itself by births and normally assessed by relating the number of births to a full or part of the population, such as number of married women or number of women of childbearing age. The definitions of the terminology used in computing different fertility rates are mentioned below:

Crude birth rate (CBR)

Ratio of the number of live births in a year to the mid year population, normally expressed per 1,000 population.

$$\text{CBR} = \frac{\text{Number of live births during the year}}{\text{Mid year Population}} \times 1,000$$

Crude death rate (CDR)

Ratio of the number of deaths in a year to the mid year population, normally expressed per 1,000 population.

$$\text{CDR} = \frac{\text{Number of deaths during the year}}{\text{Mid year Population}} \times 1,000$$

Natural growth rate

Growth rate is obtained as the difference between crude birth rate and crude death rate in the absence of migration.

Age specific fertility rate (ASFR)

Number of live births in a year to female population in any specified age group normally expressed per 1,000 women.

$$\text{ASFR} = \frac{\text{Number of live births in a particular age group}}{\text{Midyear female population of the same age group}} \times 1,000$$

Age specific marital fertility rate (ASMFR)

Number of live births in a year to married female population in any specified age group normally expressed per 1,000 married women.

$$\text{ASMFR} = \frac{\text{Number of live births in a particular age group}}{\text{Midyear married female population of the same age group}} \times 1,000$$

General fertility rate (GFR)

Number of live births per 1,000 women in the reproductive age-group (15-49) years in a given year.

$$\text{GFR} = \frac{\text{Number of live births in a year}}{\text{Midyear female population in the age-group (15-49) years}} \times 1,000$$

General marital fertility rate (GMFR)

Number of live births per 1,000 married women in reproductive age-group (15-49) years in a given year.

$$\text{GMFR} = \frac{\text{Number of live births in a year}}{\text{Midyear married female population in the age-group (15-49) years.}} \times 1,000$$

Total fertility rate (TFR)

It is obtained as the total of the age specific fertility rates (number of children born per woman of the particular age) for the entire reproductive age span. It provides the average number of children that will be born to a woman under the fertility levels indicated by the age specific fertility rates assuming that there is no mortality of women till the completion of reproductive period.

Total marital fertility rate (TMFR)

Average number of children that would be born to a married woman if she experiences the current fertility pattern throughout her reproductive span (15-49) years assuming that there is no mortality of women till the completion of reproductive period.

Age specific mortality rate (ASMR)

Number of deaths in a particular age and sex group per 1,000 population of the same age group.

$$ASMR = \frac{\text{Number of deaths in a particular age group}}{\text{Midyear population of the same age group}} \times 1,000$$

q₁

Probability of dying between birth and age 1. This can be used as approximate value of Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) which gives the ratio of number of deaths in a year of children aged less than one year to the number of births in that year.

q₂

Probability of dying between birth and age 2.

q₅

Probability of dying between birth and age 5. This indicator is also known as Under Five Mortality Rate (U₅MR).

Infant mortality rate (IMR)

Ratio of the number of infant deaths (deaths of children below one year) in a year to the number of live births in that year.

$$IMR = \frac{\text{Number of infant deaths during the year}}{\text{Number of live births during the year}} \times 1,000$$

Infant mortality rate comprises of two parts, viz., Neonatal mortality rate and Post neonatal mortality rate. The neonatal mortality rate also comprises of two parts viz., early neonatal mortality rate and late neonatal mortality rate. These are defined as:

Neo-natal mortality rate (NMR)

Number of infants dying within the first month of life (28 days or under) in a year per 1,000 live births of the same year.

$$NMR = \frac{\text{Number of infant deaths aged 28 days or under during the year}}{\text{Number of live births during the year}} \times 1,000$$

Early neo-natal mortality rate

$$= \frac{\text{Number of infant deaths of less than 7 days during the year}}{\text{Number of live births during the year}} \times 1,000$$

Late neo-natal mortality rate

$$= \frac{\text{Number of infant deaths of 7 days to less than 29 days during the year}}{\text{Number of live births during the year}} \times 1,000$$

Post neo-natal mortality rate (PNMR)

$$= \frac{\text{Number of deaths of 29 days to less than one year during the year}}{\text{Number of live births during the year}} \times 1,000$$

Perinatal mortality rate (PMR)

Number of still births plus deaths within 1st week of delivery per 1,000 births in a year.

$$\text{PMR} = \frac{\text{Number of still births and infant deaths of less than 7 days during the year}}{\text{Number of live births and still births during the year}} \times 1,000$$

Still birth rate (SBR)

$$= \frac{\text{Number of stillbirths during the year}}{\text{Number of live births and stillbirths during the year}} \times 1,000$$

Maternal mortality rate (MMR)

Number of deaths of women in the age group 15-49 while pregnant or within 42 days of termination of pregnancy from any cause related to pregnancy and child birth per 100,000 live births in a given year.

$$\text{MMR} = \frac{\text{Number of maternal deaths to women in the age group 15-49}}{\text{Number of live birth}} \times 100,000$$

Eligible couple (Couples per 1,000 population)

Number of currently married females in the age group 15-44 years per 1,000 persons of all ages.

Child woman ratio (0-4)

1. Number of children in the age group 0-4 years per 1,000 women in the age group 15-49 years.

Child woman ratio (5-9)

2. Number of children in the age group 5-9 years per 1,000 women in the age group 15-49 years.

Migration

Migration is the third component of population change, the other two being mortality and fertility.

A person is considered as a migrant by place of birth if the place in which he/she is enumerated during the census is other than the place of his/her birth.

Similarly a person is considered as a migrant by place of last residence if the place in which he/she is enumerated during the census is other than his/her place of immediate last residence outside the village or town and not simply in another house or locality in the same village or town.

Certain aspects concerning temporary movement/migration of people has been explained below as these are important components concerning migration :

i) Migration of persons in search of job is high in the country. In many cases such migrants are only seasonal in nature. People migrate to other places for work in a particular season and come back again to their usual place of residence after three or four months. All such workers are treated as migrants. Similarly, if a person moved to any other place for attending short term vocational or educational course that lasted for only few months of a year, she/he too were considered as a migrant.

ii) Where a person had merely gone out to another place or had been shifting from one place to another purely on tour, pilgrimage, visit to hospital for treatment or for temporary business purposes, such persons are not deemed to have had another residence different from the place where she/he or her/his family normally resides. She/he is not considered as migrant

iii) A woman temporarily moves into a hospital or to her parents or other relative's house for delivery and if the hospital or the parents/relatives houses is in a place different from usual place of residence, the place where the hospital or parents/ relative's house is the place of last residence of the child but not of the mother.

A new response category 'Moved after birth' was added in Census of India 2001 in the question on 'reasons for migration' to bring out additional migration patterns. Natural calamities or distress migration as a reason for migration for last residence migrants included in 1991 Census, is covered under category of 'Others'. The reason for migration has been determined as applicable at the time of migration and not in reference to any point of time after that. For example, if a person had moved from the place of her/his last residence for the purpose of education and subsequently at some point of time got employment there only, the reason for migration would be 'education' and not 'work/employment'.

Internal and International migration

The migrational movements are of three types (i) Migration within the state itself with its components (a) Migration within the district of enumeration (intra district migration) (b) Migration from one district of state to another district of state (inter district migration), (ii) Migration from one state to another

State of the country (interstate migration), (iii) Migration from one country to another country. The first two streams together constitute internal migration, while the last type of movement is called international migration. The present name of the country, state or district and not the name by which they were known at the time of her/his birth or last residence were recorded.

Rural-Urban components of migration

Rural or Urban status in respect of migrants have been determined as applicable at the time of migration and not with reference to any point of time after that.

The flow of migrants consists of four streams viz. rural to rural, rural to urban, urban to rural and urban to urban.

Civic status of urban units

Civic Status of a town/city is determined on the basis of Civic Administrative authority of the town e.g., Municipal Corporation/ Corporation, Municipal Committee/Municipal council, Municipality etc.

Size class of UA / town

Size class of UA/Town is based on the population size of the UA/City/Town. UAs./Towns with 100,000 and above population are classified as Class I UAs. / towns. These Class I UAs. / towns are now further sub classified in to seven sub classes namely M1 to M7 depending on the population size of UA/City/Town. These are M7 (5,000,000 and above); M6 (2,000,000- 4,999,999); M5 (1,000,000-1,999,999); M4 (500,000-999,999); M3(300,000-499,999); M2 (200,000-299,999) & M1 (100,000-199,999). Towns with, 50,000 to 99,999 population are classified as Class II towns, 20,000 to 49,999 population are Class III towns, population with 10,000-19,999 are Class IV towns, population with 5,000 and 9,999 are Class V towns and towns with less than 5,000 population are Class VI towns.

Slum area

The Slum Areas (Improvement and Clearance) Act, 1956 which was enacted by the Central Govt. defined slums as a) Areas where buildings are in any respect unfit for human habitation; or b) are by reasons of dilapidation, overcrowding, fault arrangement and design of such buildings, narrowness or faulty arrangement of streets, lack

of ventilation, light or sanitation facilities, or any combination of these factors, are detrimental to safety, health or morals.

Mega city

The concept of 'Mega city' is a recent phenomenon in the Urban Sociology and is defined in term of metropolitan city in the form of large size, problem of management of civic amenities and capacity to absorb the relatively high growth of population. Indian Census in 1991 treated the population size of 5 million and above as the cut off point to identify a place as the mega city. Whereas, for the purpose of inclusion in Centrally Sponsored Scheme for Infrastructure Development in Mega cities the Ministry of Urban Affairs and employment, Department of Urban Development adopted the criteria of 4 million and above population as per 1991 Census for Mega Cities. In 2001 Census, cities with 10 millions and above population have been treated as Mega cities.

(vii) 2001 Census Findings – Population, its Distribution:

(a) Distribution of population in Rural-Urban areas:

According to the 2001 Census, the total population of Kodagu district is 548,561 comprising 274,831 males and 273,730 females. The population of the district forms 1.0 per cent of the state population and ranks at 27th place among the districts. Out of the total population of the district, about 86.3 per cent lives in rural areas while 13.7 per cent lives in urban areas. Rural population of the district is distributed among 3 taluks and urban population spread over in 5 towns. The total urban population in the district is 75,382 persons comprising 38,561 males and 36,821 females. The total rural population in the district comes to 473,179 persons and is composed of 236,270 males and 236,909 females as per 2001 Census. The rural population is distributed in 291 inhabited villages and there are 5 un-inhabited villages in the district.

(b) Size-class and Civic Status of towns:

The Statement below gives the position and number of urban units according to size-class of population as per 2001 Census:

Population Growth, Density and Sex-ratio:

Population Growth:

Kodagu district witnessed a positive growth rate in each decade with 3.3, 36.0, 40.7, 17.2, 22.1, 5.8 and 12.3 per cent during the period 1901 to 2001 (except 3.1, 6.4 and 0.3 per cent negative growth during 1901-1921). According to the 1991 Census the total population of the district was 488,455. There has been net addition of 60,106 persons during 1991-2001. The decadal growth rate of the district comes to 12.3 per cent. The growth rate for the rural and urban areas of the district is 5.3 and -3.3 per cent respectively.

Density:

The population density of Kodagu district is 134 persons per Sq. Km. against the state average of 276 persons. At taluk level, the density varies between 95 persons in Madikeri taluk and 208 persons in Somvarpet taluk. In rural areas it comes to 96 persons per Sq. Km., while in urban areas it comes to 2,834 persons. In urban areas the density of population varies between 2,041 persons in Madikeri town and 5,429 persons in Somvarpet town.

Sex Ratio:

There are 996 females for every one thousand males in Kodagu district. The sex-ratio figures for rural areas and urban areas of the district are 1,003 and 955 respectively. It is also observed that, the proportion of females in rural areas is higher than that of urban areas. Sex-ratio in the age-group 0-6 comes to 977 girls per 1,000 boys in the district as a whole. In rural areas, this proportion is 975, while in urban areas the sex-ratio of Child population works out to 988 girls per 1,000 boys.

Work Participation Rate:

The work participation rate is defined as percentage of total workers to total population. According to 2001 Census, the total workers including main and marginal workers constitute 48.6 per cent of total population of the district. Of the total workers, the share of main workers is 92.9 per cent and marginal workers is 7.1 per cent. The remaining 51.4 per cent of population belongs to the category of non-workers.

As per 2001 Census among the main workers male participation rate in the district is 95.1 per cent and corresponding proportion of females is 89.3 per cent. The proportion of female marginal workers is higher than male marginal workers, as the females are attending to one or more economic activities in addition to their household duties to improve the family income. Majority of the workers are engaged in other activities. Of the total 266,378 workers in the district, 7.9 per cent of these total workers are categorized as cultivators, 4.3 per cent agricultural labourers, 0.9 per cent in household industries and 86.8 per cent in other services.

Literacy:

A person who can read and write in any language is considered as literate in Census. All children of age below 7 years are treated as illiterate.

As per 2001 Census, Kodagu district has reported 373,541 persons as literates constituting 78.0 per cent of the total population excluding the population of 0-6 years. The proportion of male and female literacy rates in the district are 83.7 and 72.3 per cent respectively. The literacy rate of males is higher than that of females. The gap in the male-female literacy rate is 11.4 per cent in the district.

The total literacy rates of rural and urban area are 76.1 and 89.7 per cent respectively. The rate of male and female literacy in rural areas is 82.1 and 70.1 per cent respectively. In urban areas this rate is 93.2 and 86.1 per cent respectively. The gap in male-female literacy rates in urban areas is 7.1 as against 12.0 in rural areas. It is thus clear that females are better educated in urban areas than their counterparts in rural areas.

(c) Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes Population 2001:

Of the 548,561 total population of the district 12.3 per cent of the total population belong to Scheduled

Castes and 8.4 per cent to Scheduled Tribes. The percentage of Scheduled Castes constitute 74.6 per cent in rural areas and 25.4 per cent in urban areas. The proportion of Scheduled Tribes is 82.6 and 17.4 in rural and urban areas respectively.

Data given in Table-1 reveals the talukwise decadal variation of population in the district. During the decade 1991-2001 it has grown by 12.3 per cent. Though the overall growth of population has increased, negative growth rate is reported in urban areas. Particularly in

Somvarpet and Virajpet taluks, the decadal variation is -19.0 and -6.4 per cent respectively. The percentage of urban population to total population in the district also indicates a declining trend except in Madikeri taluk where it has grown by 13.0 per cent.

The above table gives the sex-ratio for the rural and urban population of the state as well as that of the district from 1901 to 2001 census. It is observed that the state has recorded a decrease in the sex-ratio since 1901 census (983). However in 2001 census, the state has registered a better sex-ratio of 965 little higher than the ratio of 1991 Census (960). For the district, the sex-ratio in 1901 Census was 801, which with some

fluctuations increased over the decades. However, in 2001 Census, the district has recorded a sex-ratio of 996 better than that of 1991 Census 979. It is also observed that the sex-ratio in 2001 Census for the district (996), is more than that for the state (965). Again, the ratio for the rural women in 2001 Census is comparatively better than, that for the urban women in the state as well as in the district.

Variations in child sex ratio has been a long observed phenomenon and have undergone considerable debate among the researchers and policy makers from time to time. Although the observed variations in the ratio favouring males is a biological factor, continued decline over the periods

causes great concern among the policy makers. The taluk wise sex ratio for the 2001 Census is given in the above table which reveals that there are 977 girls per 1,000 boys. The sex ratio is equal in the rural areas of Madikeri taluk and favourable for girls in urban areas in Virajpet taluk.

The above table highlights the number of villages having different types of amenities. Not all villages in the district have all the amenities. Power supply is the only amenity provided to all villages. Educational facility is available in 92.4 per cent of the villages and among the C.D.Blocks, all villages in Madikeri have educational institution. As far as medical facility is concerned, only 47.4 percent of villages have access to health care services. In Somvarpet C.D.Block only 29.2 per cent of the villages have this facility. Though all the villages in the district have one or the other source of drinking water, the improved drinking water sources can be taken into account only if the

water is supplied through tap or a hand pump/tube well. Accordingly, 273 villages in the district have improved drinking water facility. The transport and communication such as bus services, rail facility and navigable waterways are not available for 16.8 per cent of the villages. About 90.7 per cent of the villages can be approached by pucca roads. More than 70.0 per cent of the villages have post office and telephone facility. Less than 50.0 per cent have banks and agricultural credit societies in their villages. It is observed from the table that more number of villages in Madikeri C.D.Block have better access to amenities than other two C.D.Blocks.

Health

care services are accessible to 64.1 per cent of the population. Banks serve 40.2 per cent of the population and agricultural credit societies cater to the needs to 34.2 per cent of the population. Certain amenities are not available within the village. In such cases data on distance range is given in the above table. 19 villages which do not have primary schools. This facility is available at a distance of less than 5 kms and for 3 villages at a distance range of 5-10 kms. There are 91 villages which do not have middle schools but the facility is available at a distance of less than 5 km for 73 villages, between 5-10 kms for 16 villages and more than 10 kms for 2 villages. Similarly, for majority of the villages the degree colleges are located at a distance of 5-10 kms and more than 10 kms. For most of the

The most important commodity manufactured and exported are provided in this table. It is restricted to three items in case it is more than three commodities. As such plantation of coffee and its export is the major trading activity of all the towns in the district. Apart from coffee, cut sixe timber, candle, nail (iron), barbending wire, lime, rice and

pepper are also manufactured/grown in the district. Other important exports include pepper, cardamom, oranges and paddy.

Table 48 gives the distribution of households by tenure status and the number of dwelling rooms occupied by them. The data presented in this table is for the general, Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe population of Kodagu district. It can be seen that households with 'no exclusive room' forms a small group in the district. Majority of the households live in their own structure with more

than three rooms. The median number of rooms are 4 for total households who own their houses. In the case of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, it is 2 in rural and 3 in urban areas. Households who are living in rented houses have two rooms in most cases and some households have one, three and more than three rooms. The median number of rooms in the rented structure are 3 for

the general population and 2 rooms in the case of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. Similar trend is observed in the case of households living in the other tenure.

The table gives the percentage distribution of households living in the houses defined as per Census Concept in the district. The Census houses occupied by the households for fully and partly residential purpose have been classified into permanent, semi-permanent and temporary. The households living in permanent structure in the district constitute 60,873 (49.1 per cent) and semi-

permanent structure numbers to 58,230 (46.9 per cent). Households living in temporary buildings is less in the district. In the rural areas, households living in semi-permanent houses is more compared to permanent houses. Obviously in urban areas that who live in permanent structure are comparatively higher than semi-permanent and temporary houses.

Percentage of households having improved drinking water source, electricity, bathroom, toilet and proper drainage facility will throw light on the living conditions of the people. Percentage of households having electricity and bathroom constitute around 60.0

per cent and other facilities are around 50.0 per cent. The rural-urban composition reveals that urban households are better provided with these facilities than rural households. The talukwise details can be seen in the above table.

The type of fuel used for cooking by the households are given in the above table. The different type of fuel includes firewood, crop residue, cowdung cake, kerosene, LPG, electricity, bio-gas, etc. The table highlights that firewoods used for cooking purposes are still prevalent in the society particularly in rural

areas. As high as 73.3 per cent of the households use firewoods and 20.3 per cent use LPGs. In urban areas, next to LPGs, firewood and kerosene are the other type of fuels used by the urbanites. The percentage of households using other types of fuel is negligent. Talukwise details can be seen from the table.

Households availing banking services as well as possessing specified assets are given in the above table. Little more than 50 per cent of the households in the district avail banking services. However, this percentage is comparatively higher than the State level data. About 69.5 per cent of the urbanites utilize these services. With regard to assets, radio/transistor is the only asset owned by 63.0 per cent of the households. In case of having a telephone connection or owning a bicycle, two wheeler motor cycle, car, jeep, van, etc., the data reveals less number of households possessing it. Though the urban households having in possession all these assets outnumber rural households, it is worth mentioning that 67 per cent and 37.1 per cent of urban households have television and telephone connections respectively. There are also 28.8 per cent of the households in the district do not possess any of the specified asset.

(xi) Archaeology

Kodagu is not decorated much with building or structure of great archaeological interest. There are only a few to mention. A Jain Basadi of the 15th century and the Palace, the Omkareswara temple and the Raja's tombs of the beginning of the 19th century are a few to be mentioned. The Jain basadi in Betagiri

village near Suntikoppa is built of cut stones and cut stone slabs. The figures of lotus and stone images of Thirthankara and Padmavathi of different sizes are beautifully sculptured on the pillars of basadi. Lingarajendra Wodeyar II built the Palace in Madikeri in 1812 A.D. It is a solid building but has no archaeological beauty. Considerable changes have been made to the face of the structure of this building after the manner of the European fashion, presenting a very handsome front. The whole palace is built of brick and mortar and altogether finished with solidity and elegance.

The Mausoleums of Doddavirarajendra and Lingarajendra are remarkable, built much in the style of Mohammedan edifices with a handsome dome in the center and four minaret-like turrets at the corners surmounted by basavas or bulls. The Omkareswara temple built by Lingarajendra Wodeyar is in the same style as the mausoleums of the Rajas.

Seventy-five inscriptions, six on copper plates and the others on big stone slabs, on stone pillars called Virakallus in Kannada have been found in Kodagu. Of these, the inscriptions dating from the 4th century to the 15th century are of historical interest as they are the only source material for the history of Kodagu during those centuries.

(xii) Brief description on places of religious, historical or archaeological and tourist importance in villages and places of tourist interest in the towns of the district

Abbi Falls (Madikeri Taluk) : This place is about 5 kms from Madikeri, where the Madikeri stream falls from a height. "Abbi" in Kodagu dialect means falls. This falls was formerly called the Jesse Falls in honour of a daughter of the first chaplain of Madikeri. It is much admired and frequently visited by picnic parties.

Balamuri (Madikeri Taluk) : It is a pilgrim centre and a large number of people congregate here during Cauvery festival on the 2nd day of "Tula masa". Here exists a rest house built by Dodda Virarajendra Wodeyar.

Bhagamandala (Madikeri Taluk) : This place has got the importance because of the temples near the rivers, which attract a large number of pilgrims in the month of "Tula" during the time of the Cauvery festival. The sacred rivers, the Cauvery and Kannike meet here. Tradition has it that Sujoyothi a subterranean stream joins these rivers here. It is for this reason that the place is popularly known as "Triveni Sangama" and an important pilgrim center. Four important temples just above the confluence of the rivers dedicated to Ishwara, Subrahmanya, Vishnu and Ganapathi are situated here. This place is also called as Bhagandeswara Kshetra. An inscription in Tamil and Granthakshara records the grant made to the temples by King Bhodharupa Bhagavan (14th century A.D.). Pilgrims first take a bath in the Sangama and offer oblations to their departed ancestors, then ascend the hills for a holy bath at Talakaveri.

Tippu Sultan had converted the temple premises into a fort between 1785 A.D. and 1790 A.D. and had kept a small garrison here; called the place as Afzalabad. Dodda Virarajendra of Coorg took over the fort in 1790 A.D. During the struggle three copper tiles of the roof of the temple were destroyed which were later replaced by the Raja with silver ones.

Chettalli (Madikeri Taluk) : This place is about 16 kms from Madikeri, on the Madikeri-Siddapur-Virajpet road. About 2 to 3 kms from Chettalli on the Chettalli-Suntikoppa road there is an orange

research station run by the State Government and subsidised by the Indian Council of Agricultural Research. On the way to this orange research station, the India Coffee Board maintains a coffee research sub-station.

Devatu Parambu (Madikeri Taluk) : A place about 10 kms from Bhagamandala where Tippu Sultan called some 5,000 Coorgs with their families to assemble on a big maidan in 1785 AD and then treacherously seized upon them, men, women and children, and deported them to Srirangapatna, where he converted them to Islam.

Iggutappa Devara-Betta (Madikeri Taluk) : This place is, in the proximity of the Aiyangeri forest where a lofty peak and highly venerated place for the presiding deity Subrahmanya, the patron God of the Coorgs situated.

Madikeri (Madikeri Taluk) : The headquarters of Kodagu district is a town with a population of about 33,000. "Mercara" is the name given by the Britishers to Madikeri. It is situated on an elevated plateau on the Western Ghats. A prince of the Haleri dynasty -Muddu Raja - founded Madikeri in the year 1681 A.D. The Coorg Rajas had their residence in Haleri till the founding of Madikeri. Muddu Raja selected this site for his fort and capital on account of its central as well as its inaccessible position at that time. The Raja has built the fort and the palace here. Madikeri offers to the tourist several interesting places worth a visit. Among these are the fort, the former palace, the Omkareswara temple, the Guddige (or the Raja's tombs) and the Raja's seat. The palace now houses all the important Government offices. A public library called the Mahatma Gandhi Public Library is in front of the palace to the right. In a room of this public library building a museum of historical relics and records has been opened.

Nalknad (Madikeri Taluk) : The principal country palace of the Coorg Rajas, built by Doddavirarajendra in 1792 A.D. is in Yevakapadi village of Nalknad. It is situated close to Tadiandamol, the highest peak in Coorg.

Omkareshwara Temple (Madikeri Taluk) : An important structure erected by Lingarajendra in 1820 A.D., the Omkareshwara temple is situated to the east of the fort in Madikeri. Tradition has it that

Lingarajendra put to death a very learned, pious and good Brahmin unjustly and cruelly, for having prevented the satisfaction of his carnal desire, and that in consequence, the learned Brahmin's spirit turned into a "Brahma Rakshasa" and began to torment the Raja day and night. Therefore, in order to appease the spirit of the Brahmin, the Raja built a temple and installed a "Shiva Linga" specially brought from Varanasi (Benaras). The Shivalinga was called "Omkareshwara Linga" and the temple "Omkareshwara temple". This temple is built in the Mohammadan style of Architecture - with a dome in the centre and four turrets at the four corners. There is a tank below in front of the temple, in the middle of the tank there is a small "Mantapam" connected by a narrow causeway.

Talakaveri (Madikeri Taluk) : This is the birth place of the sacred river Cauvery, on the slopes of the Brahmagiri Hills, easily accessible from Bhagamandala by road. Temples of Ishwara and Ganapathi are situated here at the source of the Cauvery. The Cauvery Jatra which begins on the Tula Sankramana day in October and continues for one full month; attracts a large number of pilgrims all over Kodagu and surrounding districts. The Pandavas are said to have visited these regions during their exile. A huge rock called "Bhimana Kallu" (the stone of Bhima) is seen on the way to Talacauvery from Bhagamandala.

Abbi Matha (Somvarpet Taluk) : This is an important Veerashaiva Matha in Somavarpet taluk, established by Dodda Virarajendra Wodeyar (18th century A.D.). Many palm leaf writings and manuscript records are available here.

Betageri (Somvarpet Taluk) : A place near Suntikoppa of Somavarpet taluk where a feudatory of Changalvas had their capital with humming life and activity.

Haleri (Somvarpet Taluk) : This place is about 10 kms from Madikeri on the Madapur road and noted for its coffee estates. Historically, this place is associated with the Haleri Rajas who later became Rajas of Kodagu. It is stated that a prince in the guise of a Jangama came from Ikkeri kingdom and established himself here, conquered the surrounding territory, held sway for a number of years. Thus, the place became important in Kodagu history.

Horamale (Somvarpet Taluk) : The remains of old walls of the palace of the Horamale branch of the Haleri royal family are found here. Now there is a cardamom plantation on the palace site.

Madapur (Somvarpet Taluk) : This place is about 20 kms from Madikeri and 19 kms from Somavarpet. The ancient family cemetery of the Coorg Rajas is here. The tomb of Lingarajendra Wodeyar I, the father of Doddavirarajendra Wodeyar and Lingarajendra Wodeyar II is situated on the banks of the Madapur River, but it has not claim to architectural merit.

Malambi (Somvarpet Taluk): This place is situated in the northeast of Kodagu on the road from Somavarpet to Sanivarasanthe. The peak close by is remarkable for the beauty of its conical shape. Though not remarkable for its height, the conical shape attracts the sightseers.

Mullur (Somvarpet Taluk) : Four miles from Sanivarasanthe, this place is noted for its Jain basadis. During the period of Gangas and Changalvas, the place had some importance as a place of religious centre though the present status of the basadis is in a dilapidated condition.

Ramaswami Kanive (Somvarpet Taluk) : The place is on the way from Kudige to Konanur in Hassan district. The Ramaswami temple situated here is an ancient origin and noted for its sanctity. Vaishyas, Vokkaligas, Devangas and other Hindus come here to celebrate weddings. This place is famous for the celebration of marriages because it is considered that no special "muhurtham" is necessary to celebrate weddings at this place. It was here that the British troops crossed the Cauvery River when they invaded Coorg under General Fraser in 1834 A.D.

Anandapura (Virajpet Taluk) : This place is the first Protestant settlement in Kodagu and is situated on the road from Siddapur to Virajpet. One of the oldest Protestant churches in the district, built in the year 1855 A.D. is situated here.

Abyatmangala (Virajpet Taluk) : This is a village in Virajpet taluk and is noted for the Attimangala channel, an irrigation work constructed in the early years of this century. This channel feeds the rich rice fields of the Abyatmangala and Valamur-Tegathur villages.

Barapole Hydro-Electric Project Area (Virajpet Taluk) : This project area is situated in Kuttandi village in Virajpet taluk near Ponnampet; designed to generate 180,000 KWs of electric power. The site area has a view of the magnificent spectacle of the mountain ranges, not seen anywhere in the South. A dam is built across the river Barapole to run the turbines.

Heggala (Virajpet Taluk) : This village, which is about 8 kms away from Virajpet, a noted mountainous pass known as “Heggala pass”, situated in the direction of South-West of Virajpet. The Heggala pass is historically famous in the military adventures of Tippu Sultan when he went through the pass to subdue the rulers of Cochin and Travancore; though several times he was pushed back. It is stated that the British forces also marched from Cannanore to Srirangapatna through this pass during their wars with Tippu Sultan.

Irupu (Virajpet Taluk) : A place of pilgrimage in Kurchi village in south Coorg and a temple dedicated to God Shiva by Sri Rama himself, on the banks of the Lakshmanatirtha river; exists here - Lakshmanatirtha is the name given to the river formed by the water falling down from the top of the hill. On the day of “Mahashivarathri”, pilgrims from several parts of the countryside congregate here to take a holy bath in the river.

Makut (Virajpet Taluk) : This place is on the borders of the Cannanore district of Kerala, in the midst of the Periambadi ghat. At one time, a small tram line was laid here to transport timber and this opened prospects for the laying of a railway line from Nanjangud to Tellicherry across Kodagu. Though the survey was completed the proposed railway line was given up due to the intervention of war.

(xiii) Scope of Village Directory and Town Directory

Village Directory

Village Directory provides micro-level data which will help the planners in formulation of micro-level developmental plans as the C.D.Block is the lowest administrative unit for developmental planning. Village wise information regarding the availability of certain basic amenities and facilities within the village, as also

that on the manner of utilization of the land in the concerned village are furnished in the village directory. The village directory format adopted for the 2001 Census has 23 columns whereas in the 1991 Census there were only 18 columns. When compared with the 1991 Census Village Directory format, column 9 which refers to the day or days of weekly market/hat if any has been now left out. New inclusions are in respect of facilities like banks, agricultural credit societies, non-agricultural credit societies, other cooperative societies, number of recreational and cultural facilities like cinema/video hall, sports club, stadium/auditorium; receipt of news papers/magazines and the name of the most important commodities manufactured in the village. In all the 23 columns in this tabulation statement, first 3 columns relates to serial number, name of the village with location code and area of village while the next 2 provide information on total population and number of households in the village as per 2001 Census. The next 8 columns relate to basic amenities such as educational; medical; drinking water (potable); post, telegraph and telephone, commercial and cooperative banks, agricultural, non-agricultural and other credit societies, number of recreational and cultural facilities such as cinema/video hall, sports club and stadium/auditorium and communications (bus service, railway station, waterway). Information in respect of approach to village, nearest town and distance in Kms., power supply, receipt of news paper/magazine, names of the most important commodities manufactured in the village are furnished in columns 14 to 18. Amenities available within the villages are shown in the respective columns and if a particular amenity especially Primary School, Middle School, College, Allopathic Hospital, PHC, MCW, Post Office, Telephone, etc., is not available in the village, the respective abbreviation is given and next to it in brackets the distance in broad ranges viz., <5 kms., 5-10 kms. and 10+ kms. of the nearest place where the facility available to that particular village is indicated. The next 5 columns, 19 to 23 provide information regarding land use (i.e., area under different types of land use in hectares rounded to two decimal places) such as forest, irrigated land by source of irrigation, un-irrigated, cultivable waste (including gauchar and groves) and finally the area not available for cultivation.

Town Directory

The Town Directory section contains seven statements (I to VII) which furnish information on all the statutory towns in the district, on aspects such as growth history, physical aspects and location of towns, municipal finance, civic and other amenities in the town, medical, educational,

recreational and cultural facilities, trade, commerce, industry and banking in the towns, civic and other amenities in slum areas of the town. The scope of the various column headings adopted during 1991 Census has remained unchanged in 2001. The towns are arranged in an alphabetical order for the district.

Note :

1. The area figure for the district given under column No 3 against “ Total” represents “Geographical Area” and has been furnished by the Surveyor General India. The figures for the urban areas are either those supplied by civic administration authorities of the towns or compiled and supplied by the Director of Survey, Settlement and Land Records or compiled in this Directorate on the basis of the available records pertaining to the delimitation of urban units. Area figures for Rural Areas are derived by subtracting the Total Urban Area from the Total Area of the District.

The total of the area figures of all the C.D. Blocks/Taluks in this district will not tally with the district figures (except urban), because the area figures for C.D. Blocks/Taluks represents the land-use area based on village wise area figures as reported by the local officers. The total area of the taluk may not tally with the aggregate of the areas of the villages listed for Census purposes for it includes the area of the statutory as well as non-statutory towns, villages which may be fully submerged and reserve forests which may not form part of any revenue village, if any, within the jurisdiction of the concerned taluk. The total area of the C.D. Block is derived by subtracting the area of the statutory town or towns (within the jurisdiction of the concerned taluks) from the total area of the taluk.

2. Out growths of towns in urban agglomerations are denoted by letter “OG”.

SECTION – I

(a) VILLAGE DIRECTORY

NOTE EXPLAINING THE ABBREVIATIONS USED IN THE VILLAGE DIRECTORY

The “Village Directory” is one of the traditional compilations of the Census. It gives the list of villages, their location numbers, their area, population, number of households, amenities such as educational, medical, drinking water, post and telegraph, commercial and cooperative banks, agricultural nonagricultural and other credit societies, recreational and cultural facilities, communication, approach to village, nearest town with a distance, power supply availability of newspaper and magazines, most important commodity manufactured and land use of each village.

Village is a statutory recognized unit having a definite boundary and separate land records. In case, a complete village is treated as an outgrowth of urban agglomeration, data on amenities for that village, have not been given in the Village Directory but shown along with the urban component. The villages which are considered as a Census Town, the amenities data are shown in the Town Directory. For those villages which have partly merged in an outgrowth of U.A., the amenities data are shown in the Village Directory for that particular village.

The ‘uninhabited’ villages (villages with no population) have been indicated as such after furnishing details in columns 1 to 3 i.e., Serial number, Name of village & location code number and area of the village against column no. 4 to 18. The land use data for such villages are shown in col. 19 to 23

The Village Directory format has 23 columns and the details given under each column are as follows :

Columns 1 : Serial Number

Self explanatory. All the villages within the CD Block are presented serially in the ascending order of their location code number.

Columns 2 : Name and Location Code Number of village

The name and location code number of the village are shown against these columns. This also includes the forest and un-inhabited villages.

Column 3 : Area of the village

The area of the village in hectares are given. Wherever the area figures was not furnished by the concerned department the column is left blank.

Column 4 : Total population

The total population of the village as per 2001 Census is given against this column.

Column 5 : Number of households

The number of households as per 2001 Census is given in this column.

Amenities

In column 6 to 23, availability in respect of different amenities such as education, medical, drinking water, post, telegraph, banks, credit societies, communication, power, approach road etc. in each village has been depicted with appropriate codes against the column concerned. Wherever the amenities are not available in the village, a dash (-) is shown in the column and next to it in brackets the distance in broad ranges viz. < 5 kms., 5-10 kms. and 10+ kms. of the nearest place where the facility is available is given. Column wise details are given below : Classes from V to VII are included in the middle school.

Column 6 : Educational

Classes upto class IV included in Primary School. This will include nursery school, kindergarten school. Pre-basic school, pre-primary school, junior basic school upto class IV.

Classes from V to VII are included in the middle school.

Classes from VIII to X included in Higher secondary school. Classes XI and XII are treated as equivalent to Pre-University Course.

In case of composite schools like middle school with primary school or secondary school with middle school, these are also included in the number of primary and middle schools, respectively.

(a) Brief note on Primary Census Abstract

The first census of the third millennium and twenty first century the Census of India, 2001 was the 14th continuous and uninterrupted Indian census since 1872. Thus, 2001 Census will provide data on population and its characteristics marking transition from one century and millennium to another.

The gigantic operation of Population Enumeration (considered by many to be the single largest and complex peace time administrative exercise in the world) was made possible due to the door to door universal canvassing of the Household Schedule by about 2 million enumerators and supervisors covering 593 districts, 5,463 sub-districts, 5,161 towns and 638,588 villages. The comprehensive Household Schedule which replaced the individual slip had three parts and two sides A and B. Part I contained the Location Particulars; Part II related to the Individual Particulars and Part III contained questions for Household engaged in Cultivation/Plantation. The part II of the Household Schedule had 39 columns and 23 questions all of which were universally canvassed and no sampling was resorted to during enumeration.

Data Processing

A quantum leap was made in the technology front while processing the Census 2001 data both for Houselisting and Population Enumeration. The Census schedules for both the phases were scanned through high speed scanners in fifteen data centers across the country and hand-written data from the schedules were converted into digitized form through Intelligent Character Reading (ICR) software for creation of ASCII records for further processing. The designing and formatting of the Household Schedule had to be done very carefully using specialized software so as to ensure uniformity, which was an essential prerequisite for scanning. The selection of appropriate state-of-art technology in data processing has made it possible to produce all the Houselisting as well as Population Enumeration tables on full count basis for the first time in the history of Census. For Census 2001, about 202 million schedules consisting of about 1,028 million records were scanned and processed within a span of only 10 months starting October, 2002.

Task Force on Quality Assurance

After the data is processed, it is expedient on the part of the data producing agency to satisfy itself about its quality before putting the same in public domain. This has to be done mainly through the process of internal consistency, comparison with similar data in the past and also through validation with likewise data if available, from external sources. Quite often the local knowledge and perception has to be brought into play to understand both the existing and the new emerging trends of population distribution and characteristics. The other very important aspect of the data quality is to ensure complete coverage of all geographical areas especially for the population enumeration phase where the data is disseminated right up to the village level in the rural areas and the ward level in the urban areas. Thus ensuring the complete coverage and correct geographical linkage of each enumeration block was one of the major planks of the quality control, specially for small area population statistics.

A very comprehensive check and edit mechanism was put in place to objectively examine the preliminary Census 2001 Population Enumeration results and finally clear them for use. The responsibility of the final clearance of data was with the Task Force on Quality Assurance (TFQA), headed by the Registrar General and Census Commissioner, India. The other members of the TFQA were the Heads and senior officers of the Census Division, Data Processing Division, Map Division, Demography Division and Social Studies Division. The Directors of Census Operations were co-opted as members whenever the TFQA discussed the data for their States/Union territories. The Directors and their senior officers were required to make detailed presentations of data for their own state both in respect to the quality and the coverage and only after the full possible cleared.

There has been a major departure in Census 2001 from the past in respect of the procedure followed for finalization of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes population. In the earlier censuses, the total Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes

populations were finalized at the time of the manual compilation of the Primary Census Abstracts (PCA) at the Regional Tabulation Offices which were specially set up for this purpose. The individual Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes population for each state was finalized much later based on manual coding done by the coders. In 2001 Census, each individual Scheduled Caste and the Scheduled Tribe have been coded directly on the computers by the Data Entry Operators through a process known as Computer Assisted Coding (CAC) and taken up along with the processing of PCA data. The CAC process involves pulling down, from the relevant dictionary of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, on the computer screen and coding from the dictionary by referring to the image of the specific individual entry in the Household Schedule appearing on the screen. The CAC of the response on Religion wherever required, was also undertaken along with the processing of PCA. This is because the Scheduled Castes status had to be determined in relation to the religion of the individual. Two Special Task Forces, one on Religion and the other on Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes were constituted for scrutiny and appropriate classification of these responses.

The main task of the Special Task Force on Religion was to appropriately merge or group the new responses encountered and code it into the appropriate religious community based on available literature and local knowledge. The Special Task Force on Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes examined the different Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes entries encountered and classified these into appropriate category of the Scheduled Castes or the Scheduled Tribes principally based on the Presidential Notification and the available literature. Thus a very systematic and scientific mechanism was operationalised to firm up the individual religion and the individual Scheduled Castes/Tribes returns. The Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes population in 2001 Census, is thus being finalized by aggregating the population data for individual Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes at appropriate geographical levels.

The entire work relating to the data validation and scrutiny was completed by all the States/Union Territories under the overall supervision and

monitoring of the Census Division of the Office of the Registrar General, India with active cooperation and support of the Social Studies Division, Data Processing Division, Data Dissemination Division and Map Division.

Primary Census Abstract

The Primary Census Abstract which is yet another important publication of 2001 Census gives basic information on Area, Total Households, Total population, Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes population, Population in the age group 0-6, Literates, Main workers and Marginal workers classified by the four broad industrial categories, namely, (i) Cultivators, (ii) Agricultural laborers, (iii) Household Industry Workers, and (iv) Other workers and also Non-workers. The characteristics of the Total population includes Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Institutional and Houseless population and are presented by sex and rural-urban residence. This data is presented at different levels, namely, India, States/Union territories, Districts and Cities, Urban Agglomerations (Population 1,00,000 and above) in three different tables. In addition, the Appendix of said publication provides Houseless and Institutional Households and their population by residence and sex for 2001 for India, State and Union territory.

Apart from the India and State/Union Territory volumes for Primary Census Abstract, the District Census Handbook contains District Primary Census Abstract, Appendix to District Primary Census Abstract, Primary Census Abstract for Scheduled Castes, Primary Census Abstract for Scheduled Tribes, Village Primary Census Abstract and Urban Primary Census Abstract of the concerned district in the state.

It was for the first time at the 1981 Census that the Primary Census Abstract (PCA) was brought out for the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes separately on the pattern of General Primary Census Abstract. This practice was continued in 1991 also. In the 1961 and 1971 Censuses, such data were made available in Table C-VIII-Social and Cultural table and to some extent in the series 'Special Tables for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes'.

The format of Primary Census Abstract has been restructured slightly in the 2001 Census as compared

to that of 1991 Census. The nine-fold industrial classification of main workers given in the Primary Census Abstract of 1991 Census has been discontinued and its place, four-fold industrial classification of both 'main workers' and 'marginal workers' are included. In 1981 census only main workers were presented in to four categories. One of the novel features of the primary census abstract of 1991 Census was the presentation of data of the population of age group 0-6 is continued in 2001 Census also. This will help the data users in better analysis and understanding of this literacy data.

Level of presentation in District Census Handbooks:

The Primary Census Abstract data in different PCAs are presented at different levels. The level of presentation of Primary Census Abstracts are as under:

The PCA Data for villages was presented CD Block wise for the first time in 1991 Census. This practice is continued in 2001 Census also. The data for each CD Block is presented both for rural and urban areas separately. All the villages within the CD Block constitute the rural portion and the Census Towns and Outgrowths are shown under the urban portion of the CD Block. In case a CD Block is spread over two or more districts, than portion which falls within the district is presented, the data pertaining to remaining portion of the CD Block is presented in the concerned District Census Handbook. The data in the Urban Primary Census Abstract for each town as well as for town with outgrowths in the district are presented. The data for all the wards and the

outgrowths of the town(s) are also presented separately below the concerned town(s).

The District Primary Census Abstract is presented in 59 columns. The Primary Census Abstract for Scheduled Castes and Primary Census Abstract for Scheduled Tribes are presented in 52 columns. The Village Primary Census Abstract and Urban Primary Census Abstract are presented in 58 columns.

The concepts and definitions used in the column heading are explained under the sub heading 'Census Concepts' in the Analytical Note. The term 'Total Population' includes the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes, the Institutional and the Houseless populations. The explanation regarding area figures presented at various level in the Primary Census Abstracts are as follows:

Area Figures

The area figures supplied by local revenue authorities of the district in respect of taluks, Police Stations and by the local bodies in respect of towns are given in square kilometers. The area figures of the villages supplied by the Tahsildars in acres have been converted and shown in hectares. The area figures of the CD Block is the total of the village areas coming under each CD Block. The area figures for the district are the same as adopted by the Surveyor General of India to maintain uniformity at the national level. The total area figures of all the taluks/CD Blocks within the district may not tally with area figures of the district because former represents land use area only. Similarly, the total of all the villages may not tally with the entire rural of Police Station/ Taluk. The difference may be due to the fact that while the area covered by hills, forests and rivers etc, have been accounted in the Taluks and P.S. level the same may not be covered under the area of the villages. Apart from this it may also differ due to varying methods of computation adopted at different levels.

An appendix to District Primary Census Abstract has also been furnished showing urban enumeration block-wise particulars on Total Population, the Scheduled Castes Population and the Scheduled Tribes Population for each town.

Fertility levels

In demography, the word fertility is used in relation to the actual production of children or 'occurrence of births specially live births'. Fertility is a measure of rate at which population adds to itself by births and normally assessed by relating number of births to size of some section of the population, such as number of married couples or number of women of child bearing age. In other words, it is a major component of population growth. In the 1991 census, questions on fertility related to age at marriage, number of surviving children at present, number of children ever born alive and children born alive during the last one year were asked. The first three questions were asked to all evermarried women and the last question related to currently married women.

MIGRATION**What is Migration?**

Migration is the third component of population change, the other two being mortality and fertility. A person is considered as a migrant by place of birth if the place in which he is enumerated during the census is other than the place of birth. Similarly a person is considered as a migrant by place of last residence if the place in which he is enumerated during the census is other than his place of immediate last residence.

Internal and International migration

The migrational movements are of three types (i) Migration within the state itself with its components (a) Migration within the district of enumeration (intra district migration), (b) Migration from one district of state to another district of state (inter district migration), (ii) Migration from one state to another state of the country (interstate migration), (iii) Migration from one country to another country. The first two streams together constitute internal migration, while the last type of movement is called international migration.

Why people migrate?

As in 1981 census, the reasons for migration were elicited in 1991 & 2001 census also. The reasons for migration were broadly categorized as (1) employment (2) business (3) education (4) family moved (5) marriage (6) natural calamities like drought, floods etc. and (7) other reasons. Reasons for migration have been elicited only with reference to movement from place of last residence.

Impact of migration

Growth of population of a particular place depends upon natural increase due to excess of births over deaths and migration. Knowledge of trends in migration helps in future planning of a region.

Marriage and age at marriage are important social phenomena and crucial factors in the analysis of the dynamics of fertility. As such, various measures of fertility estimated based on these crucial factors are highlighted in the above table.

Estimates of General Fertility Rate (GFR) a refined measure of fertility, defined as the number of live births per thousand women in the reproductive age-group 15-49 years is a useful tool for measuring fertility, and this rate is further estimated only for the married women which is defined as General Marital Fertility Rate (GMFR). The GFR and GMFR for the district are 98 and 140 respectively.

The cumulative value of the age-specific fertility rates at the end of the child bearing ages gives a measure of fertility known as Total Fertility Rate

(TFR). It indicates average number of children expected to be born per woman during her entire span on reproductive period assuming that the age specific fertility rates to which she is exposed to, continue to be the same and there is no mortality. The same is expected for married women known as Total Marital Fertility Rate (TMFR). The estimated TFR and TMFR for the district are 2.77 and 5.43 respectively. The Crude Birth Rate (CBR) is 26.30.

The most useful indices that can be derived from the question on number of children born alive is the average number of children ever born per ever married women by age-group. Since most of the women complete their reproduction by the age-group 45-49, this indices is termed as completed fertility. The category ever married includes widows, divorced

and separated women. As such the completed fertility for the district is 4.02. The child women ratio which is a relative measure to know the fertility performance of a women is 377 in the district.

One of the parameters, presenting female age at marriage relates to all women who live

with their husbands, where some of them might have been recently married and some of them decades ago. It can be observed that mean age at marriage of the currently married women of Kodagu district is higher than the state figure of 18.00.

The estimates of mortality indicators presented above have been obtained through indirect estimation using the data on the number of children ever born and number of children surviving to ever married women. The information on questions on children ever born and children surviving canvassed for all ever married woman have been tabulated by the age of the mother. This data has been converted into estimates of probability of dying before attaining a given age. These estimates have been worked

out using Brass technique where (q_i) is the probability of a newborn child dying before the age $i = 1, 2, 3$ and 5 . The table above shows the estimates of infant and child mortality derived for the year 1991 by sex.

The infant mortality rate (q_1) for the person is 41 and for male and female are 43 and 42 respectively. The estimates of under 5 mortality (q_5) for person is 66 and for male and female are 72 and 59 respectively.

The interstate in-migration to the district by their place of birth provided above, highlights the States with the largest contribution of migrants to the district. According to 2001 Census findings, large inflow of migrants are mainly from Kerala and Tamilnadu which accounts for 57.26

and 33.24 per cent respectively. The migrants reported from other States of Andhra Pradesh, West Bengal and Orissa is marginal. Further the category migrants from 'Other States' has increased from 1.96 per cent in 1991 to 4.12 per cent in 2001.

ANNEXURE - V

Brief account of Main Religions in the District / Taluk as per 1991 & 2001 Census

Religion forms an integral part of Indian Social System. For an Indian, it is a way of life rather than a faith. Indian Census, since its inception is collecting data on religion and presenting the same in its reports. In the pre-independence Census reports, the data on religion was being presented

for 6 major religions viz., Hindus, Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, Jains and Buddhists. Besides, the minor religions have been classified under the category of 'Others'. The data on religion collected and presented by the Indian Census is the basic data of immense use for the researchers, anthropologists, sociologists, demographers, administrators, planners and even for a common man.

India - State differentials

The comparative data of the country and the state of Karnataka presented in Annexure V(1) reveals that the religion wise concentration of population in the state of Karnataka is of three major religions viz., Hindus, Muslims and Christians. Hindus are returned on the higher side with over three per cent more than the national average. Christians recorded nearly one per cent less whereas the proportion of Muslims in the state to national population was almost the same. There are 85.5 per cent Hindus, 11.6 per cent Muslims and 1.9 per cent Christians in Karnataka as against that of 82.4 per cent Hindus, 11.7 per cent Muslims and 2.3 per cent Christians in India. In regard to concentration of other three major religions viz., Sikhs, Buddhists and Jains it is observed that Jains with 0.7 per cent form the fourth major religion in the state whereas Buddhists with 9.8 per cent is the third major religion in India. In the Indian scene the Sikhs form fifth major group, whereas in Karnataka, Buddhists and Sikhs are placed fifth position.

Religion wise growth in the state during the decade 1981 - 91 reveals that the major religions viz., Hindus, Muslims and Christians recorded a growth rate in lesser degree i.e., 20.7 per cent, 25.7 per cent and 11.1 per cent respectively, against that of 22.3, 26.1 and 16.9 per cent in India as a whole. On the other hand Buddhists, Sikhs and Jains recorded a growth rate of 72.8 per cent, 57.8 per cent and 14.6 per cent respectively for the state against that of 34.0, 24.2 and 3.9 per cent respectively for India. Thus, the Jains recorded a higher growth of nearly 11 per cent in the state than that of India as a whole during the decade 1981 - 91.

Percentage distribution of population during 2001 Census, by major religions in India and Karnataka shows that Hindus form majority of the population with 80.5 and 83.9 per cent respectively, while Muslims form 13.4 and 12.2 per cent for the country and state respectively. The proportion of these religions for the country and state, during 1991 Census was 82.4 per cent and 85.5 per cent for Hindus and 11.7 and 11.6 per cent for Muslims. There are not

The above table furnishes the composition of six major religions along with 'Other Religions' and 'Religion not stated' among the districts of the state during 2001 Census along with 1991 Census. As may be seen from the table that the proportion of population to total population during 2001 Census is below 5 per cent for 23 districts of the state and is between 5-10 per cent in 3 districts. Only Bangalore district has the distinction of having more than 10 per cent of the total population of the state in its jurisdiction. During 1991 Census the situation was almost similar with 22 districts having a proportion of

less than 5 per cent and 4 districts had more than 5 per cent but below 10 per cent. With 10.76 per cent of the total population Bangalore district occupied the top position.

Of the total population of the state, proportion of districts having Hindus and Muslims was uniform during both the Censuses i.e. less than 5 per cent of the total population in 21 districts for Hindus and 23 districts for Muslims, while in 5 and 3 districts respectively for Hindus and Muslims had a proportion of 5-10 per cent and Bangalore district alone had more than 10 per cent.

The percentage distribution of population by major religion in Karnataka and Kodagu district for 1991 and 2001 Censuses are presented in the above table. As may be seen from the table that in

Karnataka, Hindus form 85.5 and 83.86 per cent of the total population during 1991 and 2001 Censuses, followed by Muslims and Christians. The corresponding statistics for the district does not

differ much as Hindus and Muslims occupy the top two places followed by Christians. These three religion cover more than 99 per cent of the total population of the district. Remarkable increase in

the proportion of Buddhists population has been noticed between 1991 and 2001 Censuses in the State.

The level of education by sex for the district and the State during 1991 and 2001 Census are presented in the above annexure. It can be seen that percentage

ANNEXURE - VIII

DISTRIBUTION OF DIFFERENT MOTHER TONGUE RETURNED DURING 1991 & 2001 CENSUS

As part of Census publication programme the data on spoken languages/Mother Tongues will be presented under C Series. The table C-7 shows the distribution of languages/Mother Tongues which returned 10,000 or more speakers each at all-India level (including of Mother Tongues grouped under each for the district, with total, rural/urban and male/female break ups). The unclassified Mother Tongues and the Mother Tongues having less than 10,000 speakers have been relegated to 'Other' Mother Tongue category. The table is divided into Part A-Scheduled languages with Mother Tongues grouped under each and Part B-Non-scheduled languages with Mother Tongue grouped under each. The instructions to the enumerators in regard to this question read as under.

“Record Mother Tongue in full, whatever be the name of the language returned by the person enumerated”. The definition of Mother Tongue is the same as in 1991. “Mother Tongue is the language spoken in childhood by the person’s mother to the person. If the mother died in infancy, the language

mainly spoken in the person’s home in childhood will be the Mother Tongue. In case of infants and deaf mutes the language usually spoken by the mother should be recorded. In case of doubt, the language mainly spoken in the household may be recorded”.

As the above instructions to the enumerators would show, the respondent was made to feel free to return the name of his/her Mother Tongue and the same was recorded faithfully by the enumerators. This naturally leads to recording of a very large number of Mother Tongue names. It is to be mentioned that Mother Tongues as returned in the Census are basically, the designation provided by the respondents. These designations or Mother Tongue labels need not be identical with the actual linguistic mediums. For assessing the correlation between the Mother Tongue designations and actual languages and dialects the raw returns of Census were subjected to thorough scrutiny and rationalization.

The abstract of languages as Mother Tongues and their strength in the district during 1991 and 2001 Census are provided below.

The statement I & II gives a clear picture of the languages spoken in the district. A closer study of 2001 Census data reveals that as many as 31 languages which returned 10,000 or more speakers are spoken in the district. The 'Other' category include Mother Tongues spoken by less than 10,000 speakers. Majority

of the population speak Kannada which constitute 35.2 per cent followed by 23.48 per cent of Malayalam speaking population. Among the languages not specified in the Eighth Schedule to the constitution, Coorgi is spoken by 16.81 per cent of population. Similar data for 1991 is provided in the annexure.

Linguistic classification of the languages

The names of the 114 Scheduled and Non-Scheduled languages falling in the five language families are given below with the Scheduled Languages denoted as (S). Of the 18 Scheduled Languages, 13 fall in the Indo-Aryan branch of the Indo-European family, 4 in the Dravidian family and one in the Tibeto-Burmese family.
